♦ To facilitate all lawful meetings and processions.

We facilitated a total of six public meetings and nine processions in 2005 without incident and will continue to facilitate all lawful meetings and processions.

SUMMARY

Last year (2005) was a very successful year for Sai Kung Division, one of the best in recent times. The significant efforts of Mr TSUI Wai-hung, Mr B.  - ➤ 2,445 crime cases were reported in Tseung Kwan O Division in 2005, representing a drop of 92 cases (-3.8 %) as compared with 2,542 cases in 2004.
 - Two special teams formed by Kwun Tong District have put and will continue to put in full effort to counter burglaries in low-density village houses and public housing estates. 188 cases of burglary were reported in Tseung Kwan O Division in 2005, representing an increase of 14 cases (+8.1 %) when compared with 174 cases in 2004.
 - Upon completion of Wave I of the Public Housing Estate Access Control Project that was implemented by Regional Crime Prevention Office in December 2004, Wave II of the project was launched in 2005. To prevent and combat estate burglaries, the police work hand-in-hand with property and security companies and housing estate management offices. 12 crime prevention seminars were held throughout the year. An enquiry hotline was also specifically set up for security personnel in public housing estates to seek assistance from officers of the Crime Prevention Office on security problems at any time.

Since its implementation in early 2005, Area Policing has continued to function smoothly. High levels of police presence have been maintained in Tseung Kwan O Division and strong support and assistance from Kowloon East Region has also continued. To combat quick cash crimes, police have provided and will continue to provide a strong, visible uniformed police presence. Whenever necessary, additional resources from KE Regional HQs will be enlisted to counter any unexpected incidents.

• To answer all emergency calls within the pledged response time.

➤ In 2005, Tseung Kwan O Division responded to 21,389 '999' calls, of which 1,633 were emergency ones, and failed to meet the pledged response time on 11 occasions. The overall successful response rate was 99.3 %.

• To interdict criminal activities connected to triad, vice, drugs and unlawful gambling through intelligence based policing.

Freung Kwan O Division and District Crime Headquarters have continued to operate jointly to combat local triad elements, especially cases involving youths. District Crime Headquarters has maintained close liaison with Regional Crime Headquarters for intelligence exchange.
