<u>Progress Report of Age-Friendly City Working Group</u> under Sai Kung District Council Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee

The first meeting (2016) of the Age-Friendly City Working Group (the Working Group) under Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee (SSHSCC) was held on 28 April 2016. The main issues discussed at the meeting were summarized as follows:

Endorsing the Membership List of the Age-Friendly City Working Group

- 2. The Working Group was set up with the endorsement from the SSHSCC, which followed the practice of last year. The Working Group consisted of 11 SKDC Members and six elderly representatives. The six elderly representatives were from two District Elderly Community Centres and two Neighbourhood Elderly Centres. Besides, the Working Group also consisted of two organization representatives, one representative from the Hong Kong Council of Social Service, one representative from the Sai Kung District Office and one representative from the Social Welfare Department. The elderly representatives were nominated by the relevant organizations and endorsed by the SSHSCC with the recommendation from the Working Group. Besides, there would not be any substitute elderly representative for this term. In order to maintain the numbers of SSHSCC Members and elderly representatives at an appropriate ratio, the Working Group agreed that the maximum number of elderly representatives should be set at six persons.

Roles of Members of the Age-Friendly City Working Group

4. The Working Group discussed at the meeting the roles of members of the Working Group. It was agreed that the operation of the Working Group could be reviewed on a regularly basis.

Discussing the arrangements for age-friendly city activities

- 5. Regarding the funding of \$53,000 granted under the Funding Scheme on Age-friendly Community by the Labour and Welfare Bureau (LWB) and the Elderly Commission, the organization representatives would look into the feasibility of different activity programmes, including workshops, guided tours, forums, community education programmes on dementia, etc. for discussion at the meetings in future. The relevant organizations would be invited to submit funding applications after the SSHSCC meeting in May.
- 6. The Working Group discussed the issues on "Pilot Scheme on Residential Care Service Voucher for the Elderly" and "Pilot Scheme on Community Care Service Voucher for the Elderly". It was hoped that the LWB could attend the SSHSCC meeting to explain the schemes.

Discussing the comments raised by the elderly regarding local services

- 7. Apart from the issues on "Pilot Scheme on Residential Care Service Voucher for the Elderly" and "Pilot Scheme on Community Care Service Voucher for the Elderly", the elderly representatives gave other comments on local elderly services which mainly focused on facilities and medical services.
- 8. After discussion, the Working Group agreed to refer the road safety issues related to bicycles to the Traffic and Transport Committee for follow up. For issues related to local age-friendly facilities, the Working Group would discuss the issues at the next meeting and refer them to the District Facilities Management Committee for follow up. As for issues related to medical services, the Working Group would continue to follow up at future meetings. Regarding the inadequacy of seats inside shopping centres, the Working Group asked the Secretariat to write to the Link REIT to relay the elderly representatives' comments to them and invite them to attend the next meeting of the Working Group.
