# <u>Progress Report of</u> <u>Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities</u> <u>under Sai Kung District Council Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee</u> <u>(Part 1)</u>

The second meeting (2016) of the Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities (the Working Group) under the Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee (SSHSCC) was held on 7 September 2016. The main issues discussed at the meeting were summarized as follows:

### **Briefing on Co-organized Activity Application**

2. The representative from the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups Sai Kung & Wong Tai Sin Outreaching Social Work Team briefed Members on the "E. Positive - Employment Exploration Programme" and answered their enquiries.

4. After discussion, the Working Group agreed to return the remaining amount of \$550,000 certified by the Healthy and Safe City to the FAC for arrangements for other activities.

In respect of the Interschool Quiz Competition on "United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities" to be held on the International Day of Disabled Persons, the Working Group, after discussion, agreed to recommend the participant schools, upon receipt of their applications by the Secretariat, to the Hong Kong Joint Council for People with Disabilities and the Hong Kong Council of Social Services.

# <u>Progress Report of</u> <u>Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities</u> <u>under Sai Kung District Council Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee</u> <u>(Part 2)</u>

The first and second joint meetings (2016) of the Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities under the SKDC Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee (SSHSCC) and the Working Group on Road Safety in Sai Kung District under the Traffic and Transport Committee (TTC) were held on 4 August 2016 and 7 September 2016 respectively. The main issues discussed at the meetings were summarized as follows:

# The Sai Kung Bicycle and Road Safety Campaign 2016-2017

2. The Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities under the SSHSCC and the Working Group on Road Safety in Sai Kung District under the TTC had set aside \$100,000 and \$80,000 respectively (a total of \$180,000) to co-organize a campaign on bicycle and road safety. Members gave their suggestions regarding the nature and the venue of the activities and discussed the relevant issues at the first joint meeting. The Working Group agreed to: (1) invite the Hong Kong Road Safety Association to apply for the funding to co-organize the campaign for this year; (2) invite the Hong Kong Police Force (HKPF) to become a co-organizer; and (3) contact the Cycling Association of Hong Kong, China to provide suggestions on safe cycling.

### The number of accidents involving bicycles in Sai Kung district

3. The Working Group wrote to the HKPF after the first joint meeting to ask for the number of accidents involving bicycles in Sai Kung district, so as to forward the information to the co-organizers of the campaign for organizing the activities. At the second joint meeting, the Working Group agreed to request the HKPF to re-compile the number of accidents involving bicycles submitted earlier by listing the number of those involving pedestrians.

### Membership of the Working Group

4. The Working Group noted the withdrawal of Ms. Christine FONG from the Working Group on Road Safety in Sai Kung District.

### Assessment on Activity Application

5. At the second joint meeting, the Working Group discussed the above application with the content summarized as follows:

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6. The Working Group agreed to recommend the application for co-organization of activities to the SSHSCC and the TTC. However, the applicant organization would need to revise some of the columns of the funding application form and submit the relevant supplementary information.

7. The Working Group proposed that, if this application was approved by the Finance and Administration Committee, the whole amount of reserved funding (i.e. \$80,000) of the Working Group would be used to sponsor this activity. The outstanding amount would be borne by the reserved funding (i.e. \$100,000) of the Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities.
