

**Progress Report of
Social Services Working Group
under Sai Kung District Council Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee**

The first meeting (2017) of the Social Services Working Group under Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee (SSHSCC) was held on 26 April 2017. The main issues discussed at the meeting were summarised as follows:

The relevant organisations had, when introducing the activity at the meeting or at the time when they submitted the proposals, explained that the nature of the courses that required to hire tutors were not general interest classes, the reasons being that social workers were present when the training courses were conducted, and the participants had to serve the community after completing the training courses. In view of this, the Working Group was satisfied with the training purposes of the relevant courses, and accepted what all the above organisations said that the classes they organised were training classes. The Working Group endorsed that no deduction would be made regarding the funding applications for fees for tutors from all organisations, and asked the Secretariat to critically examine the tutors' qualifications submitted by the organisations.
