

**Progress Report of  
 Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities  
 under Sai Kung District Council Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee**

The first meeting (2017) of the Working Group on Healthy and Safe City Activities (the Working Group) under Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) Social Services & Healthy and Safe City Committee (SSHSCC) was held on 9 May 2017. The main issues discussed at the meeting were summarised as follows:

### **Discussion on the Work Plan of This Year**

2. The SKDC had reserved a total of about HK\$700,000 for the above-mentioned activities. In addition, a funding of about \$110,000 was required to be reserved this year for printing the “Yearly leaflet on injury surveillance” and the maintenance of the Sai Kung Healthy and Safe City web page. A DC funding of \$100,000 had also been reserved for organising age-friendly activities in the past. After discussion, Members agreed to request the SKDC to provide additional funding for the activities of the Working Group.

3. Regarding the printing of the “Yearly leaflet on injury surveillance”, after discussion, the Working Group considered that the leaflets produced by the contractor last year did not meet its requirements. In view of this, the Working Group would specify the necessary conditions and standards for producing the publicity leaflets, including the use of environmentally friendly ink, etc., when it invited quotation this year.

4. As the Working Group needed to handle many issues and activities this year, it would not co-organise the Sai Kung Bicycle and Road Safety Campaign with the Working Group on Road Safety in Sai Kung District this year.

### **Any Other Business**

5. Regarding the Occupational Safety & Health Campaign, after discussion, the Working Group agreed that the Secretariat should write to organisations in the District inviting them to submit activity proposals and financial budgets on the above Campaign. The applicant organisations did not need to give report at the meetings of the Working Group, the SSHSCC

would select the appropriate applications and recommend them to the Occupational Safety & Health Council directly.

6. As for the Safe Community Occupational Safety and Health Campaign, after discussion, it was agreed that Members could invite interested organisations to submit applications to the Working Group, which would then select the appropriate applications for recommending to the Occupational Safety & Health Council.
