Progress Report of Sai Kung District Council Signature Project Scheme Committee

The second meeting (2017) of the Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) Signature Project Scheme Committee (SPSC) was held on 30 March 2017. The major issues discussed at the meeting were summarized as follows:

Reconstruction of the Sharp Island Pier

- 2. The Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) commenced the project on 6 February 2017. It was expected that the temporary pier would be completed for public use in mid-2017. The new pier was expected to complete in the latter half of 2018.
- 3. The local artists appointed by the Sai Kung District Office (SKDO) had drawn murals on the two hoardings at the site boundary for beautification purpose.
- 4. The Kick-off Ceremony for the Reconstruction of the Sharp Island Pier was held in the afternoon of 30 March 2017 at the Sharp Island Pier. On that day, about 80 guests, including 15 SKDC Members attended the ceremony. After the ceremony, about 40 participants joined the hiking activity along the hiking trail between Kiu Tsui Beach and Hap Mun Bay constructed under the District Minor Works Project.

<u>Construction of the Tseung Kwan O Heritage Hiking Trail and the Heritage Information Centre</u>

- 5. Members noted the progress of the project:
 - The project commenced on 14 February 2017;
 - The SKDO handed over the slope improvement works and the installation of rockslide protection barriers for the Information Centre (Site A) and the hostel (Site B) to the contractor of the CEDD on 31 March 2017. The works was expected to complete within 12 months. The public toilet at Duckling Hill (Site C) was also expected to complete within 12 months after the works commenced. Upon completion, the public toilet would be handed over to the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department for opening it up to the public.
- 6. Publicity and Promotion

Publicity items (e.g. pamphlets, environmentally friendly bags, etc.) were produced for promoting the projects.
