Sai Kung District Office (SKDO) assists to implement, -

1.1 District Administration To help promote district administration and reflect local views.

(A) District Council

To continue providing support to the work of Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) after the reform of District Councils of the HKSAR Government, including encouraging community involvement, proposing district minor works and managing local facilities such as community halls etc.

(B) District Management Committee (DMC)

5.2 Environmental Protection Department

The Department Protection (EPD) is mainly responsible for enforcing environmental legislations, implementing policies on environmental and handling protection, pollution complaints in Sai Kung District through its Regional Office (East). Besides, in order to facilitate environmental compliance, **EPD** established has partnership programmes with trades and offered assistance and advice on compliance related matters. Moreover, activities are also organised with District Councils and local communities promote to public awareness and concern for environmental matters.

Environmental Action Plan for Sai Kung District

EPD will continue to keep a close watch on pollution problems in the district. Our primary action items are as follows:

<u>Item 1</u>: To enforce environmental legislation.

Target: To implement control over polluters by enforcing environmental protection legislation; and to manage and monitor pollution problems in the district through different permit and licensing systems.

<u>Item 2</u>: To address community needs and handle pollution complaints.

Target: To provide prompt response to enquiries and complaints about pollution in the district through a hotline service; to conduct investigation under our purview and prosecute offenders.

<u>Item 3</u>: To partner with various trades in promoting environmental compliance.

Target: To form partnership with trades and to enhance their knowledge on environmental protection and promote environmental compliance through seminars, guidelines or liaison meetings.

<u>Item 4</u>: To arouse public awareness on environmental protection.

Target: To deepen the general public's understanding of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) charging and promote waste reduction and recycling through Green Outreach and to arouse public awareness of environmental protection through collaboration with local communities.

Priority Items for 2024-25

- To conduct various anti-flytipping measures in the district including ambush operations to flytipping hotspots for around 8 times a month and installation of CCTV surveillance cameras at strategic locations.
- To arouse awareness of heavy vehicle drivers on environmental hygiene issues through displaying education banners along Wan Po Road and distributing leaflet as well as issuing reminder notes to landfill users without proper cover for their transported waste at entrance of the SENT landfill extension.

Objective

- To provide residents with community recycling support and environmental education activities, the Recycling Station GREEN@SAI KUNG in Po Lam Lane, Recycling Stores GREEN@PO LAM in MCP Central, GREEN@SAI KUNG TOWN in Man Nin Street, Sai Kung and its Tiu Keng Leng Branch in Ocean Shores have commenced operation separately between August 2021 and January 2023.
- Green Outreach will continue to promote waste reduction and recycling in the community. To tie in the implementation of MSW charging on 1 April 2023, the Green Outreach has stepped up the promotion of MSW charging since mid-August 2023 through promotion activities and on-site demonstrations in housing estates, residential buildings and Recycling Spots of the GREEN@COMMUNITY network, etc., to deepen the general public's understanding of MSW charging, and to educate the public and frontline staff of housing estates/residential buildings to comply with the legislative requirements and actively practice waste reduction and recycling.
- To complement the implementation of MSW charging, the EPD plans to develop a network of Recycling Stores in public rental housing (PRH) estates to facilitate their residents and those living nearby to participate in clean recycling and enhance the cost effectiveness of the recycling network. We are preparing to expand the network to 50 PRH estates progressively starting from the end of 2023, which includes PRH estates in Sai Kung district.
