Report on the Meeting of District Facilities Management Committee  
held on 19 February 2008

- (1) Members noted the briefing on “District Minor Works Programme”.
- (2) Members endorsed the formation of three standing working groups and their terms of reference and elected the convenors of the following working groups:

(a) Working Group on the Management of Recreation and Sports Facilities	Ms. CHAN LO Yin-bing, MH
(b) Working Group on the Management of Community Halls and Libraries	Ms. LAM Chung-yan
(c) Working Group on District Facilities Works	Mr. LO Wai-kwok, MH, JP

- (3) Members endorsed the proposed estimates of 2008/2009 District Minor Works funding:

<u>Committee</u>	<u>2008/2009 Proposed Estimates</u>
(a) District Facilities Management Committee	\$7,858,500
(b) Development and Housing Committee	\$7,858,500

- (4) Members endorsed the proposed estimates of 2008/2009 Expenditure Head 9.
- (5) Members discussed the management policy of Sha Tin District Community Halls and resolved the following issues:
  - (a) endorsed to follow the current management policy of Sha Tin District Community Halls with a vote of 24 in favour and 1 against,

- (b) endorsed the lowering of the limit of participants to not less than five for the first round application of using the hall for Ping Pong and Badminton activities with a vote of 13 in favour, 7 against and 6 abstentions,
- (c) endorsed the lowering of the limit of participants to not less than five for the second round application of using the hall with a vote of 18 in favour and 7 abstentions,
- (d) objected to the extension of the notification period to 14 working days with a vote of 2 in favour, 16 against and 5 abstentions,
- (e) endorsed the trial of opening at 7 a.m. for some of the community halls with a vote of 25 in favour and 2 abstentions, and
- (f) passed the following motion with a vote of 21 in favour, 1 against and 2 abstentions:

“The District Facilities Management Committee strongly urges the Administration to confirm as soon as possible the allocation of school campus that ceased operation for the use of cultural, recreational and sports activities in order to alleviate the serious shortage of community halls and relevant facilities.”

- (6) Members noted the report on the management of Sha Tin District recreational and sports facilities.
- (7) Members noted the report on the management of Sha Tin District public libraries.
