搶劫案是將軍澳分區另一個主要關注的問題，尤其是涉及少年罪犯方面。透過收集情報及在罪案現場的迅速行動，警方在二零零四年首六個月共偵破 6 宗搶劫案。期間，將軍澳分區共發生過 19 宗搶劫案，較二零零三年同期的 38 宗減少了百分之五十。而以欺壓手段搶劫的案件方面，大部份案件均涉及青少年罪犯，在二零零四年一月至六月的平均每月宗數是 0.5 宗。

In respect of burglaries in Clear Water Bay Road area, there were a total of 47 cases recorded in the first six months of 2004, compared with 60 cases in the same period of 2003, representing a decrease of 22%.

Due to the geographical situation, most burglaries in the areas along Clear Water Bay Road are believed to have been committed by illegal immigrants landing in the area, and to a lesser extent, the Two Way Permit holders and local villains. Kwun Tong District Intelligence Section continues to analyze the crime pattern and to identify targets for strategic deployment of police resources.

Another major concern of the Division is robbery, particularly involving young offenders. The police in the first six months of 2004, through intelligence gathering and prompt action at crime scenes, detected 6 robbery cases. During this period, there were a total of 19 cases of robbery, compared with 38 in the same period of 2003 (decrease of 50%). In respect of bullying type robbery, which mainly involves young offenders, the average monthly figure for Jan to June 2004 stood at 0.5 case.

To fight against Theft from Vehicle, Pickpocket, Snatching and Street Deception, all being quick cash crimes, the police have provided and will continue to provide a strong, visible uniformed police presence. Whenever necessary, additional resources from KE Regional HQs will be enlisted to counter any prevalent crimes problems.

Action against organized street gambling and drug trafficking activities has been set as one of the Division's top priorities. District Crime Headquarters, District Special Duty Squads and Tseung Kwan O Divisional personnel have put in full effort and resources to suppress these nefarious activities.

To work in partnership with other government departments, schools, NGOs and the community at large to prevent and reduce unlawful activities, particularly juvenile crime.

The police have adopted and will continue to adopt a multi-agency approach to tackle youth and juvenile crimes. Anti crime messages have been conveyed to young people by the police through various channels, in conjunction with other government departments and NGOs. Distribution of fight crime leaflets, seminars to students and the Junior Police Call Scheme are an on-going exercise, which has always been high on the agenda for the District.

Operation Partnership Scheme 伙伴行動 is one of the initiatives implemented by Regional Crime Prevention Office to counter estate burglary. In the first six months of 2004, 14 seminars were given to security and property management personnel throughout the Region. The scheme works hand-in-hand among the police,
