



Tuen Mun District Policing Plan – 2011

The Tuen Mun Police District Policing Plan 2011 outlines this District's key enforcement priorities for the coming year.

The plan fully supports the Commissioner's and New Territories North operational priorities and sets out the key areas for policing in the year ahead. It is aligned with the Force's Strategic Direction 2010-12 to expand existing community networks to engage all sectors in Tuen Mun. We aim to gain both public support for and an awareness of daily police operations and will focus our effort on community and intelligence-led policing.

The units and officers under my command will make every effort to make our community a safe place in which to live and work. We are grateful to existing partnerships within the community and will continue to work with you throughout the coming year, focusing our effort in the following priority areas.

Violent crime

- Strong police presence by uniform and plainclothes officers in areas with prevailing crime, housing estates, the town centre and high-risk premises.
- Respond professionally to, and investigate, all reports of violent crime (Robbery, Serious Assaults and Domestic Violence).
- Provide crime prevention advice through a partnership approach involving Police Community relations, Crime prevention officers as well as Community leaders, Community groups and the District Liaison Officers.

Triads, Syndicated and Organised Crime

- Immediate and high profile response and investigation of all reports of gang or triad related activities involving extortion and serious assaults.
- High-profile police deployment and investigation in relation to all reports of debt collection.
- Intelligence-led operations against Triad personalities, their activities and source of income.
- Close monitoring of incidents and activities likely to involve triads in village or local affairs and land use.

Dangerous Drugs

- Promote a partnership approach in the prevention of drug abuse in the community, especially amongst young people. Community relations and schools liaison officers will actively conduct activities with community groups and educators.

- Cultivate and collate intelligence on drug trafficking activities and deploy additional resources to mount operations against illicit drug traffickers and trafficking syndicates.
- Ensure landlords of premises used in dangerous drug activities are accountable for the use of their premises.

Quick Cash Crime

- Tasking uniform and plainclothes police to problematic areas for crime and identified 'Quick cash' crime. Intelligence-led policing to identify and arrest habitual criminals.
- Community policing through engaging the local community with activities by Crime Prevention and Police Community Relations officers to increase awareness in crime prevention. Maintain close liaison with Community groups, the elderly and new immigrants/visitors to prevent and detect topical crime.

Public Safety

Road Safety

- Liaison with District T&T Committee, Community groups and Traffic New Territories North on road improvement schemes and local traffic issues.
- Prompt deployment of uniform duties to incidents to maintain a free flow of traffic, with enforcement through the Selective Traffic Enforcement Policy, 'STEP'.
- Education and publicity through schools and road safety campaigns with a focus on the safety of pedestrians and



cyclists.

- Liaison with Traffic New Territories North on their enforcement against speeding, driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol, road racing and overloaded vehicles on major highways.

Terrorism

- Enhance the awareness and readiness of police officers and the community to surface and combat terrorist activity and co-ordinate with security personnel and other police units on the key points and critical Infrastructure in Tuen Mun.
- Provide day-to-day policing and co-ordinate response under Operation Eraser in accordance with current Threat assessments.

Local Operational Priority

Illegal Immigration

- Enforcement and operations focused against reports and intelligence on illegal activities by visitors and illegal immigrants.
- Operations and police presence to interdict street-level crime, metal theft and pick-pocketing.

Burglary

- Enhance cooperation with Village Representatives, Housing and Building management and their security personnel, Incorporated owners, Car Park operators and their staff.
- Promoting public awareness by publicity



Debt Collection Related Crime

- Enhance cooperation with Housing and Building management and their security personnel and Incorporated owners
- Conduct security checks to residential buildings
- Questionnaire and checklist for thorough investigations of debt collection related crime activities
