Written reply from Hong Kong Disneyland Resort

Hong Kong Disneyland Resort takes the health and safety of its Guests and Cast

Members seriously. It is our top priority to provide a safe and comfortable environment

for our Guests. We appreciate the question about birds in the park raised by Islands

District Council Member Ms Lee Kwai-chun.

Wild birds are part of our natural environment. Hong Kong Disneyland Resort is a

premium attraction that blends in perfectly with our natural environment, offering our

Guests with the best possible entertainment experience. At the same time, our

horticulture team and pest control specialists have put in place a number of bird control

measures. These measures include bird nets and bird repellers at various locations

around the park which help manage the landing and roosting of birds.

In addition, Guests are made fully aware that they should not feed wild birds. We have

posted approximately 130 signs throughout the Resort, including all outdoor dining

areas and numerous other locations, reminding our Guests not to feed birds. The

signage includes English and both traditional and simplified Chinese. From time to time,

Cast Members will also remind our Guests orally not to feed birds.

Dedicated teams of Cast Members are also tasked with maintaining our stringent level of

hygiene in the park both during and after park opening hours. During park operating

hours, Cast Members perform regular cleaning to ensure our high standards of

cleanliness are maintained. After park operating hours, thorough disinfecting and

cleaning works take place every night.

At Hong Kong Disneyland Resort, we believe that respect for the environment is an

important part of how we do business. We will continue to provide all of our Guests with

a comfortable, safe and enjoyable experience at our park.
