Islands District Office was requested to report to the Committee at the end of the current year on the utilization rate of the Islands District community hall, so that members could discuss whether the opening hours of the community hall would continue to be extended.

Progress Report on Approved DC Funded 'District Minor Works Projects' from 2008/09 to 2013/14

6. Members noted the contents of the paper, and raised enquires on the progress of a number of projects. Members agreed that “Beautification Project of the Lot adjacent to Cheung Chau Pak Tai Temple (IS-DMW-058)” and “Restoration Works of Mangrove at Discovery Bay (IS-DMW-129)” would be deleted from the list of District Minor Works, and that “Construction of a footpath between Sam Pak and Sze Pak(item five of the annex)” would not be included in the list. In addition, “Construction Works of Wo Tin Bridge in Mui Wo (IS-DMW-056)” would be renamed as “Improvement of the footbridge at Wo Tin Village, Mui Wo” and would be followed up on by the Tourism, Agriculture, Fisheries and Environmental Hygiene Committee. The Committee also approved the implementation of the feasibility study for “Construction of Pedestrian Walkway Covers at Shun Tung Road, Tung Chung (IS-DMW-053)” and at a cost of \$680, 000, and that the initial estimate for the project was \$ 8.1 million.
