5. The Committee approved the funding of \$671,300 for the six projects below:

- Replacement of the Air Circuit Breaker at Peng Chau Sports Centre;
- Improvement Works for Tung Chung Swimming Pool;
- Improvement to Lifesaving Equipment of Islands District Beaches;

- Replacement of Roof Exhaust Fan for Lift of Cheung Chau Sports Centre;
- Improvement to Manhole at Artificial Turf Pitch of Man Tung Road Park; and
- Provision of Storage to Hung Shing Yeh Beach and Lo So Shing Beach.

6. Members noted the contents of the paper and enquired about the progress of various projects. The Committee noted that the cost required for the installation of elevator at Peng Chau Clinic was initially estimated at \$11,300,000. The Committee approved a funding of \$800,000 for conducting a feasibility study.
