Enhanced Cleansing of Hygiene Blackspots of Food and Environmental Hygiene Department

Members agreed with the four focal spots proposed by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) where enhanced cleansing actions would be taken. Members also proposed some other spots where hygienic conditions were less than satisfactory for the Department's consideration. Members requested the Department to enhance public education and to strengthen law enforcement against those who violated hygienic legislations.

2. Members were appreciative of the FEHD's work in rat prevention. The Department was urged to strengthen anti-mosquito actions at places where there were many children. The Department was also asked to consider establishing public market(s) in Tung Chung.

3. The Committee approved the funding of one million dollars for the implementation of the above projects.

4. Members approved the contents of the paper and that the most updated funding for "Construction of footpath and lookout point near Ngan Chau, Peng Chau" (IS-DMW-608) was \$970,100. Members also agreed that the "Construction Works of Wo Tin Bridge in Mui Wo" (IS-DMW-056), which originally was under the District Facilities Management Committee, would be renamed as "Improvement of the footbridge at Wo Tin Village, Mui Wo", and would be included in the list of works under the TAFEHC.
