Question on addition of public toilets in Yat Tung Estate, Tung Chung

Members requested the Housing Department to consider providing public toilets in Yat Tung Estate which would be open around the clock. The Housing Department and the LINK were also requested to consider opening the toilets in Yat Tung Estate Market around the clock to provide convenience to residents of the Estate and professional drivers.

Question on finding of sand fleas in Discovery Bay Beach

2. Members proposed the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) to provide professional advice of pest control to the management company of Discovery Bay Beach. The FEHD was asked to pay attention to the pest and rodent control work at Nim Shue Wan and Tai Shui Hang.

Third Batch of Proposed Projects under District Minor Works of Tourism, Agriculture, Fisheries and Environmental Hygiene Committee for 2014/2015

3. The Committee approved the initial vetting by the Islands District Office (ISDO) on eight District Minor Works projects proposed by members. The ISDO would report the results to the Committee so that members would consider whether to include initially feasible proposals into the District Minor Works Projects list of the Committee.

4. Members approved the contents of the paper and enquired about the progress of some projects. The Committee also approved the funding of three projects as follows:

- Construction of Footpath near Tai Ho Wan. Mui Wo at \$405,800;
- Formation of fire breaks and grass cutting in Islands District at Tung Chung and Tai O (2014-2015) at \$397,610; and
- Formation of fire breaks and grass cutting in Islands District at Lamma and Po Toi (2014-2015) at \$479,520.
