Marine Port District will ensure the security and control of the waters in our area of responsibility. We will provide a professional policing service at sea and on the outlying islands by focusing our efforts on the prevention and detection of crime, as well as ensuring as swift a response as possible to emergency calls. We will continue to develop and enhance good community relations and foster a partnership approach with community-based organizations and other government departments. We will ensure a high degree of effort is given towards enhancing public safety on both land and sea.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES

Violent Crime

Maintain a robust response capability to maritime threats

- Deter violent crime by delivering a strong police presence in population centres on outlying islands, particularly at high-risk locations
- Professionally handle and investigate all reports of violent crime

Triads, Syndicated and Organised Crime

- Strengthen intelligence-led operations against target triad personalities and activities, organised crime, syndicated illegal immigration and smuggling activities, in particular those that exploit youths
- Leverage the cross-boundary mechanism, make full use of available resources and technology, and adopt a multi-agency approach to deter and interdict organized criminal activities, especially syndicated illegal immigration activities

Take measures to investigate and confiscate the proceeds of crime

Dangerous Drugs

- Take robust action against drug traffickers, especially those exploiting students and youths
- Deter the abuse of illicit drugs on the outlying islands and vessels
- Promote awareness and prevent the abuse of drugs by students and youths, through a multi-agency and community-based approach

Quick Cash Crime

 Promote public awareness and secure community support to combat miscellaneous thefts and quick cash crime, particularly telephone, Internet and social media deception, on the islands, and at sea

Cyber Security and Technology Crime

- Promote public awareness of technology crime and cyber security, as well as the risks associated with social media
- Work with key partners to promote maritime industry awareness of technology crime and cyber security

Public Safety

- Ensure public order and safety of public events through effective planning, communication and execution
- Enhance sea safety awareness, and regulatory compliance, within the seafaring communities
- Take measures to enhance safe cycling and pedestrian safety on the outlying islands
- Apply the Selected Traffic Enforcement Priorities (STEP) to ensure smooth traffic flow, especially on weekends, and public holidays, on the outlying islands
- Strengthen preparedness for a quick and effective response to major incidents and natural disasters by conducting regular multi-agency exercises with key partners, so as to test and improve contingency

<u>Terrorism</u>

- Ensure a proactive patrolling profile at the ISPS facilities, and visiting vessels, as well as critical infrastructure, and other key points to enhance deterrence and protection
- Strengthen counter-terrorism capability, preparedness and response to marine security incidents, in addition to the ISPS Code, through the regular review of contingency plans, frequent exercises and drills, and the co-operation and co-ordination of the Inter-Departmental Counter Terrorism Unit
- Promote the awareness and focus of counter-terrorism efforts with all stakeholders for the marine security incidents, in addition to the ISPS Code requirements

Illegal Immigration and Smuggling

- Deter and interdict illegal immigration and smuggling
- Combat illegal activities by illegal immigrants and visitors on the outlying islands

Supporting Maritime Environmental Protection

• Conduct joint operations, through a multi-agency approach, to combat criminal/illicit activities, in particular involving the use of explosive and other destructive methods, with implications for conservation or the environment

MANAGEMENT PRIORITIES

Engaging the Community

- Develop and enhance our relationship with the seafaring and islands communities, in order to forge a more effective police/public partnership
- Continue, and develop, specific initiatives to engage the youth-in-need, the elderly, non-ethnic Chinese (NEC), and Recreational Sea Safety community

Enhancing Personal and Professional Qualities of Force Members

- Promote a high standard of conduct and integrity in support of Force core values and ethics
- Promote training and culture building to improve the standards of policing, seamanship and safety
- Enhance the awareness of occupational safety and health

Strengthening Criminal Intelligence Gathering

 Promote a culture of information gathering by all officers in support of the Force Criminal Intelligence System (FCIS)

Supporting Frontline Units

- Promote staff empowerment and ownership to enhance operational effectiveness, promote safe systems of work and raise morale
- Enhance frontline officers' capabilities by adopting appropriate technology

Information Security

- Maintain officers' vigilance towards the risks of data leakage and enhance their awareness of information security principles, in particular under the FISS
 - Implement and manage the IT Warden system within MPDIST to enhance information security

Manpower and Succession Planning

- Address succession planning through Marine Policing Knowledge Management activities, mentoring and on-the-job training to appropriately equip younger officers with Marine Policing skill sets
- Retain the experienced officers by encouraging their applications for further employment and final extension-of-service

Resource Management

To establish a culture of prudent resource management in respect of fuel, electricity and other resources, balanced with operational need
