Violent Crime

Against the Public

Deter violent crime involving local youths, holidaymakers and residents.

Domestic Violence

Reduce domestic violence by early intervention.

Interim Report

1. Between January and June 2016, Cheung Chau Division had received a total of 15 reports of violent crime and only two of them involved domestic violence. Of the reported cases, 13 cases were detected and detection rate for these types of offence were 81.3% & 100% respectively.
2. With a view to engage youth in needs within the Cheung Chau Division to prevent young person fallen into delinquency, the District Youth Engagement Team under the command of Police Community Relations Officer, has been established in April 2012, the team is required to conduct regular night patrol on the frequent gathering spots of the youth, active soft approach is adapted, which not only providing a platform to enhance youth communications direct with police but also enable police to understand the actual needs of the youths. The District is working in hand with the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (Cross Centre) to provide healthy activities on personal development and community initiatives. A total of 236 young persons have been engaged by the team, 45 of them were engaged in previous quarters this year.

3. To further the enhancement of personal development and responsibilities, the District introduced the Project “TEENBEACON” with the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (Cross Centre) on January 2016, to strengthen the young persons’ self-confident and career planning abilities. Professional consultation, personal development training, vocational advises and interview workshop are arranged for the members. A total of 18 members were recruits in the first six month, five of them were successfully passed the Police Constable Recruitment process, whilst others are being employed in different fields.

Continuing Prevention Measures

1. Enhanced uniform patrol at crime blackspots.
2. CCDIV will conduct regular high profile operations in the District with the assistance of PTU and Regional Crime Unit, Marine.

Operational Priorities

Triads, Syndicated and Organized Crime

1. Interdict triad and syndicate controlled smuggling activities.
2. Detect and prevent extortion.
3. Interrupt triad sources of income.

Interim Report

Between January and June this year, the smuggled goods a total of \$14,853,564 had been seized (seized the electronic applicants occurred mainly in Cheung Chau Eastern area and Victoria Harbour Eastern area) and 14 people were arrested as a result of Police action & joint operation with Customs & Excise Department and Immigration Department.

Continuing Prevention Measures

1. Proactive anti-smuggling operations will continues.
2. Maintain close contact and strengthen intelligence exchange with other Districts and local community.

Operational Priorities

Dangerous Drugs

1. Prevent dangerous drugs trafficking and abuse on outlying islands.
2. Deter the abuse of dangerous drugs on pleasure.

Interim Report

1. Between January and June 2016, Cheung Chau Division had detected a total of 8 drugs cases. Out of 4 are serious narcotics cases and remained 4 cases are about possession of dangerous drugs. Total of 9 people were arrested and none of the arrested persons are aged under 20 years old. (Totally seized 1 gram of Herion, 99.2 grams of Ketamine, 5 grams of methylamphetamine and 3 bottles of Cough-syrup).
2. Police Community Relations Office of Marine Port District continues to work with local community to carry out publicity campaigns against youth drug abuse, including the “Islands District Anti-Drugs and Fight Crime Carnival 2016” in the Summer of 2016; “Navigator”, the anti-drug ambassador training programme; “Anti-Drugs Football Competition” and the “Islands District Anti-Drugs Pioneer Training”. The District will continue to promote the anti-drugs messages through the Junior Police Call and Senior Police Call.

Continuing Prevention Measures

1. Maintain close contact with local schools and community organization.
2. Strengthen intelligence exchange with other Districts.
3. Enhance uniform patrol at crime blackspots.
4. Police Community Relations Officers jointly will continue to work with local community to carry out anti-drug abuse publicity.

Operational Priorities

Quick Cash Crime

1. Prevent and deter quick cash crime on outlying islands.
2. Gain public support to fight quick cash crime.

Interim Report

Between January and June this year, Cheung Chau Division had received 4 Deception, 3 Burglary cases (occurred in residential premises, stolen properties were laptop, watches, jewellery and cash); and 16 Theft case for investigation. 13 of the Theft cases were detected. The detection rate was 81.3%.

Continuing Prevention Measures

1. The District will continue to adopt a multi-agency approach by joining various local organizations and the Islands District Fight Crime Committee to hold regular deception prevention talks for local residents., especially the elderly, in order to enhance their alertness to “Quick Cash” Crime and gain their support in prevention.
2. Cheung Chau Division adopted a “One Police One Village Scheme” at Yung Shue Wan and Sok Kwu Wan to engage and work in partnership with the community to fight crime.

Interim Report

1. Between January and June 2016, Cheung Chau Division had assisted various groups on the Island to conduct numerous public meetings and processions including the week long Tai Ping Ching Chiu Festival safely and in good order.
2. Between January and June 2016, Cheung Chau Division had issued a total of 60 summonses to those who had violated traffic regulations. Within this period, Cheung Chau Division received 7 traffic accident reports (involving bicycle, village vehicle, ambulance and police vehicle).
3. Between January and June 2016, 3 summonses were issued to those who had violated maritime safety regulations.

4. The Police Community Relations Office, the Islands District Council, the Regional Hong Kong Road Safety Team, The Hong Kong Road Safety Patrol, the Senior Police Call and the Junior Police Call had jointly conducted a series of Road Safety Publicity Campaigns, including seminars on safe cycling and driving of village vehicles and distribution of road safety leaflets, between January and June this year in Cheung Chau, Lamma Islands and Peng Chau. With a view to reduce traffic accident. Further enhance the safety of riding bicycle & tricycle, Cheung Chau Division has broadcasted the safety use of bicycle / tricycle with relevant legislation at ferries and pier to reduce traffic accident.

Continuing Prevention Measures

1. Marine Port District will continue to conduct public safety publicity with local community and will ;
2. Continue to enhance Road Traffic and maritime enforcement action.

Between January and June 2016, our police district had adopted a multi-agency approach to strengthen our preparation against terrorism by holding 14 ISPS facilities examinations and mounting joint exercises together with the persons-in-charge of designated port facilities, the government departments concerned and the police counter-terrorism unit.

Illegal Immigration


Deter II's involvement in illegal activities in the waters of Hong Kong, including fuel smuggling, illegal clam dredging and fishing.

Interim Report

A total of 7 "Operation Champions" were mounted to combat illegal immigration activities within the District. Between January and June this year, 36 illegal immigrants were arrested by officers of Marine Port District.
