Opening Remarks

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (“CICRC”) and government representatives to the 10th meeting of CICRC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

2. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had not received any notice of absence from Members before the meeting.

I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 9th Meeting of CICRC

3. The Secretariat had earlier circulated the draft minutes of the last meeting to all Members. Members had not raised any other comments prior to and during the meeting. The minutes of the 9th meeting were confirmed.

II. Report on Arts and Cultural Activities Organised by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (“LCSD”) in Kwun Tong District (KTDC CICRC Paper No. 17/2025)

4. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

5. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

5.1 Members enquired about the age and social groups of the activity participants.

5.2 Members suggested that LCSD organise activities at outdoor venues with high pedestrian flow.

5.3 Members pointed out that the weather had been very hot recently and suggested that

LCSD enhance ancillary facilities for outdoor activities.

5.4 Members enquired about the actual number of participants in the first phase of the “Lullabies” programme, which was a highlight trial programme under “Unbox EKCC”. They commended the successful outcome of the programme and hoped that LCSD would organise more similar programmes in the future to attract public participation.

6. The representative of LCSD responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:

6.1 Regarding the target groups of the activities, LCSD indicated that the relevant information had been included in the event posters and descriptions.

6.2 Regarding the activity venues, LCSD stated that it would continue to identify suitable venues in the district to attract more members of the public to participate in the activities.

6.3 Regarding the ancillary facilities for outdoor activities, LCSD stated that some arts groups would provide cooling items such as paper fans for the audience. The department would also remind the groups to set up fans at the venues to maintain good ventilation.

6.4 Regarding the “Lullabies” programme, LCSD reported that the first phase of the activity had achieved nearly a 90% attendance rate and attracted more than 3 600 participants. Owing to the enthusiastic response, the programme was extended from its original run from 2 to 31 July 2025 until 16 August 2025.

**III. Report on Recreation and Sports Programmes Organised by LCSD in Kwun Tong District
(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 18/2025)**

**IV. Report on Promotional Activities Organised by Public Libraries of LCSD in Kwun Tong District
(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 19/2025)**

10. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.
11. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
 - 11.1 Members enquired about the number of participants that could be accommodated in each session of Storytelling for Children.
 - 11.2 Members enquired about the details of Book Exhibitions.
 - 11.3 Members enquired about the criteria for setting up a mobile library service point.
12. The representative of LCSD responded to Members' views and enquiries as follows:
 - 12.1 Regarding Storytelling for Children, the department stated that each session held in small libraries and district libraries in the district could accommodate about 16 to 30 participants.
 - 12.2 Regarding Book Displays, the department stated that thematic books for adults, children, and new titles were selected each month for display on designated bookshelves to encourage the public to read.
 - 12.3 The department stated that mobile libraries mainly supported district and small libraries by providing services to areas located farther away from static libraries. The locations of the mobile library service points would be determined based on factors such as population distribution, service demand, and parking locations.
 - 12.4 The department stated that there were currently 12 mobile library vans across the territory, with 10 mobile library service points in Kwun Tong District. A review and reallocation of the service points in Kwun Tong District had been conducted in 2023, including relocating the Choi Ying Estate stop to Choi Fook Estate and setting up new stops at On Tat Estate and On Tai Estate. Members who had any views on the service point arrangements were welcome to contact the department.

13. Members further enquired whether LCSD had set any standards regarding the distance between mobile library service points and static libraries, and whether additional service points could be set up in the district.

14. The representative of LCSD responded that there were currently 12 mobile library vans serving all mobile library service points across the territory. As there were no plans to increase the number of vans, the likelihood of setting up new service points in the district was relatively low. Nevertheless, the department would allocate resources according to the actual needs of the district. Regarding distance, the department would consider the walking distance between service points and static libraries.

15. The Chairman enquired about the total number of mobile library service points across the territory and the visiting frequency of the mobile library vans.

16. The representative of LCSD stated that the frequency of mobile library van visits depended on service demand. For example, the vans stopped at Laguna City twice a week, while at On Tat Estate and On Tai Estate once every two weeks.

V. Any Other Business

17. Members did not raise other items.

VI. Date of Next Meeting

18. The next meeting was scheduled to be held at 2:30 p.m. on 11 September 2025 (Thursday).

19. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:59 p.m.
