**Opening Remarks**

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (“CICRC”) and government representatives to the 2nd meeting of CICRC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

**I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 1st Meeting of CICRC**

2. The Secretariat had circulated on 7 March the draft minutes of the last meeting to all Members. Members had not raised any other comments prior to and during the meeting. The minutes of the 1st meeting were confirmed.

**II. Report on Arts and Cultural Activities to be Organised by Leisure and Cultural Services Department (“LCSD”) in Kwun Tong District in 2024-25**  
**(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 4/2024)**

3. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

4. Members noted the paper.

**III. Report on Recreation and Sports Programmes to be Organised by LCSD in Kwun Tong District in 2024-25**  
**(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 5/2024)**

5. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

6. Members suggested that LCSD should carry out more promotion of new sports in the community and organise more activities for persons with disabilities.
7. The representative of LCSD said that apart from the activities mentioned in the paper, the LCSD Headquarters would liaise and collaborate with various disability groups in the 18 districts every year to organise activities for persons with disabilities.
8. Members enquired about the details of activities for youth at risk.
9. The representative of LCSD said that the department would collaborate with social workers from the community centres in the district to arrange specific activities, such as badminton or basketball, for youth at risk.
10. Members noted the paper.

**IV. Promotional Activities to be Organised by Public Libraries of LCSD in Kwun Tong District between April 2024 and March 2025**  
**(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 6/2024)**

11. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.
12. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
  - 12.1 Members were pleased to know that LCSD provided publicity materials for library activities to Members through the Secretariat. However, they considered the design of the promotional posters rather dull and suggested that LCSD should use colourful designs for better publicity effect.
  - 12.2 Members hoped that LCSD would provide information on the “Exhibition of The National Flag, Emblem and Anthem of the People’s Republic of China” and the thematic talks after the meeting, in particular the date and time of the exhibition to be held at Lam Tin Public Library, so that Members could promote the activities to the local residents.
  - 12.3 Members commended LCSD for organising exhibitions and thematic talks with attractive content, and suggested organising more activities on Chinese culture, Chinese history and national affairs in public libraries in the future to further promote national education.

- 12.4 Members enquired whether LCSD had cooperated with local groups or estate offices in organising library activities, including the “Pop-up Library” and “Joyful Reading at Your Neighbourhood: Library-on-Wheels”, at locations with high pedestrian flow in the district so as to enhance the effectiveness of the activities.
- 12.5 Members were pleased to see LCSD organising library activities related to national education, and said that if LCSD could provide exhibition boards or information to Members or Care Teams, Members would be glad to assist in promoting and publicising the activities in the community.
- 12.6 Members enquired about the details of the “Pop-up Library”.
- 12.7 Members suggested offering courses in public libraries to teach the public about the application of artificial intelligence technology.
13. The representative of LCSD responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:
- 13.1 Regarding the promotional posters, LCSD would improve the relevant designs based on Members’ views and would continue to provide various publicity materials to Members so that they could assist LCSD in promoting its activities in the community.
- 13.2 Regarding the details of the “Exhibition on The National Flag, Emblem and Anthem of the People’s Republic of China”, LCSD said that the exhibition would be held from 1 to 14 April at Lam Tin Public Library, followed by roving exhibitions in the remaining five libraries in Kwun Tong District. Members who were interested in organising the exhibition in sub-districts were welcome to contact LCSD after the meeting.
- 13.3 LCSD thanked Members for their commendation for the exhibitions and thematic talks. LCSD agreed that efforts should be made to deepen the local residents’ understanding of the country and national affairs. The department would continue to organise relevant activities.
- 13.4 Regarding the “Pop-up Library” and “Joyful Reading at Your Neighbourhood: Library-on-Wheels”, LCSD turned two mobile library vans into Library-on-Wheels, each equipped with hundreds of thematic books, self-borrowing and returning equipment and tablets, to promote reading and electronic resources. The two Library-on-Wheels would travel to housing estates and schools in the community and participate in large-scale events to promote library services. The “Pop-up Library” would be held at

different venues in the 18 districts, usually for one day. Apart from Library-on-Wheels, there would also be reading activities such as booth games and handicraft workshops to attract public participation.

13.5 LCSD said that Library-on-Wheels currently had two parking spots in Kwun Tong District, including Richland Gardens and Cheung Wo Court. The Library-on-Wheels had been parked at On Tat Estate and On Tai Estate in the past but had now been replaced by regular mobile libraries. LCSD added that the mobile libraries provided basic lending services, including book borrowing and return, reader registration, reservation of library materials and payment services.

13.6 Regarding offering courses on artificial intelligence in public libraries, LCSD acknowledged the rising popularity of artificial intelligence and would consider inviting suitable organisations to organise related activities in the future.

14. Members noted the paper.

**V. Report on Arts and Cultural Activities Organised by LCSD in Kwun Tong District (KTDC CICRC Paper No. 7/2024)**

15. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

**VI. Report on the Recreation and Sports Programmes Organised by LCSD in Kwun Tong District from December 2023 to January 2024 (KTDC CICRC Paper No. 8/2024)**

17. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

18. Members referred to the section of the paper on the “Community Sports Club (“CSC”) Project”, which indicated that a total of 28 CSCs had been established in Kwun Tong District so far. They hoped that LCSD would provide more information for Members’ reference.

19. The representative of LCSD said that relevant information would be circulated to Members through the Secretariat after the meeting.

(Post-meeting note: the Secretariat forwarded the supplementary information provided by LCSD on CSCs in Kwun Tong District to Members on 19 April 2024.)

20. Members said that the paper showed that the actual number of participants in many elderly activities far exceeded the estimated number. Hence, they enquired with LCSD about whether resources were insufficient and how LCSD calculated the actual number of participants.

21. The representative of LCSD explained that for some elderly activities, participants could register on the spot and the attendance rate was calculated based on the number of participants. Many elders would join the activities on the spot. If some of the elderly participants left early and did not participate in the whole activity, their quotas could be used by other interested elders through walk-in enrolment, resulting in the actual number of participants being higher than the estimated number.

22. Members noted the paper.

**VII. Report on Promotional Activities Organised by Public Libraries of LCSD in Kwun Tong District**  
**(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 9/2024)**

23. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

24. Members noted the paper.

**VIII. Any Other Business**

25. The Chairman said that the matter of nominating “Sports Ambassadors” was referred to CICRC by the Chairman of KTDC at the 2nd Full Council meeting held on 7 March for follow-up discussion. To promote the importance and benefits of regular participation in sports and other physical activities to the public, LCSD hoped to obtain the support of KTDC to nominate no less than two KTDC members to serve as the new term “Sports Ambassadors” for Kwun Tong District. The Sports Ambassadors would participate in the community sports activities organised by LCSD and assist in encouraging the people of Kwun Tong District to actively take part in sports activities and build up a healthy lifestyle. The term would last until the end of December 2025.

26. At the meeting, nine Members expressed interest in serving as “Sports Ambassadors” for Kwun Tong District. In addition, the Chairman said that four other KTDC Members had indicated

their interest in becoming “Sports Ambassadors” prior to the meeting.

27. The representative of LCSD said that in the past, district councils normally nominated two to four members to serve as “Sports Ambassadors”, but she would relay the enthusiastic response from Members to the LCSD Headquarters after the meeting.

28. The Chairman thanked Members for their enthusiastic support and suggested selecting four Members through a draw to be nominated as the “Sports Ambassadors” for Kwun Tong District. Members agreed to this approach.

29. After the draw, the Chairman announced the nomination of Mr PANG Chi-sang, Mr TSANG Wing-fai, Mr YU Siu-lun and Ms FU Pik-chun to serve as the new term “Sports Ambassadors” for Kwun Tong District.

30. Members suggested that LCSD change the Chinese name of “Sports Ambassadors” from “活力專員” to “活力大使” in the future.

31. The representative of LCSD would convey relevant views to the Community Programme Unit of LCSD.

32. Members noted the relevant matters.

#### **IX. Date of Next Meeting**

33. The next meeting was scheduled to be held at 2:30 p.m. on 9 May 2024 (Thursday).

34. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:19 p.m.
