**Opening Remarks**

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (“CICRC”) and government representatives to the 7th meeting of CICRC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

2. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had not received any notice of absence from Members before the meeting.

**I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 6th Meeting of CICRC**

3. The Secretariat had earlier circulated the draft minutes of the last meeting to all Members. Members had not raised any other comments prior to and during the meeting. The minutes of the 6th meeting were confirmed.

**II. Report on Arts and Cultural Activities to be Organised by Leisure and Cultural Services Department (“LCSD”) in Kwun Tong District in 2025/26 (KTDC CICRC Paper No. 1/2025)**

4. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

5. Members suggested that LCSD (i) list the actual attendance for Members’ reference after completion of the activities; (ii) distribute tickets for the trial programmes of the East Kowloon Cultural Centre (“EKCC”) to Care Teams and District Council members and collect their feedback on the activities; and (iii) incorporate more Chinese cultural elements into arts and cultural activities to deepen young people’s understanding of the Motherland.

6. The representative of LCSD responded to Members’ views and enquires as follows:

6.1 LCSD extended its gratitude to Members for their views and stated that it would review the effectiveness of the activities.

6.2 Regarding the trial programmes of EKCC, LCSD thanked Members for their support and said that their views would be relayed to the responsible personnel.

6.3 Regarding activities promoting Chinese culture, LCSD said that the Love and Faith Cantonese Opera Laboratory, an arts group under the 18dART Community Arts Scheme, would organise a series of promotional activities to promote Chinese culture.

7. The Chairman hoped that LCSD would continue to promote Chinese culture by organising activities.

8. Members noted the paper.

**III. Recreation and Sports Programmes to be Organised by LCSD in Kwun Tong District between April 2025 and March 2026**  
**(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 2/2025)**

9. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

10. Members raised follow-up views and enquiries as follows:

10.1 Members enquired about the reason for LCSD's selection of billiards as the district sports activity with local characteristics in Kwun Tong District, as well as the effectiveness of the relevant activities.

10.2 Members pointed out that the paper showed that LCSD planned to organise 35 billiards activities in 2025/26, with an estimated attendance of approximately 888, and enquired how LCSD arrived at these figures.

10.3 Members enquired whether LCSD would strengthen the promotion of the sports events of the 15th National Games ("NG").

10.4 Members enquired whether LCSD would formally designate new sports as recreation and sports activities, thereby enabling the public to apply for venues to conduct

related activities.

- 10.5 Members enquired whether LCSD would develop sports incorporating artificial intelligence (“AI”) elements.
- 10.6 Members enquired whether LCSD had increased the frequency of “Briefing on Proper Ways to Use Fitness Equipment” (“Briefing”) sessions and also enquired about the waiting list mechanism.
- 10.7 Members enquired whether LCSD had formulated guidelines for the reference of organisations interested in co-organising new sports-related activities with the Department.
- 10.8 Members enquired about the operations of the 28 sports clubs in Kwun Tong District.

11. The representative of LCSD responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:

- 11.1 Regarding the reason for choosing billiards as the district sports activity with local characteristics, LCSD explained that Shun Lee Tsuen Sports Centre in Kwun Tong District was the only billiard centre under LCSD equipped with both billiard tables and American pool tables. The centre was also the largest facility of its kind under LCSD’s management. Apart from being available for public booking, it also provided a dedicated training venue for the Hong Kong billiard representative squad, organisations and schools, further promoting the sport. As for the effectiveness of the activities, LCSD noted that billiards activities were usually fully booked and were particularly popular with students.
- 11.2 Regarding the number of billiards activities and participants, LCSD pointed out that the figures represented the total estimated number of activities and participants for the American Pool Training Courses, Snooker Training Courses and Billiard Fun Day.
- 11.3 Regarding NG, LCSD said that Hong Kong would stage eight competition events this year, including basketball, track cycling, fencing, golf, handball (men), rugby sevens, triathlon and beach volleyball, as well as a mass participation event—bowling. At the district level, LCSD noted that all 18 districts would later organise various activities to support and promote NG.

- 11.4 Regarding new sports, LCSD said that the New Sports Fun Day would be coordinated by the LCSD headquarters and would promote one of the six new sports: dodgeball, dodgebee, kin-ball, korfbal, pickleball or tchoukball. In addition, LCSD stated that new sports would not be formally designated as regular recreational and sports activities until they had developed to a certain extent and achieved sufficient participation. Therefore, LCSD would continue to assist in promoting new sports.
- 11.5 Regarding the development of sports incorporating AI elements, LCSD responded that it would consider the feasibility of incorporating AI elements as an auxiliary feature in specific sports events.
- 11.6 Regarding the operation of the 28 sports clubs in Kwun Tong District, LCSD said that all the listed sports clubs were operating normally. LCSD staff would assist different sports clubs in booking venues and promoting their activities. The Community Sports Club Unit of LCSD would regularly follow up and review the operations of different sports clubs.
- 11.7 Regarding the Briefing, LCSD said that the number of briefing sessions held this year remained the same as last year. As the briefing sessions were highly popular among the public, LCSD currently conducted computer balloting from the 1st to the 7th of each month. In addition, LCSD pointed out that if participants were absent from the briefing session or failed to complete the check-in procedure, their spots would be allocated to those waiting on-site.

12. Members suggested that LCSD provide them with detailed information about the 28 sports clubs in Kwun Tong District after the meeting.

13. The representative of LCSD noted Members' views and stated that detailed information would be provided later.

14. Members noted the paper.

**IV. Promotional Activities to be Organised by Public Libraries of LCSD in Kwun Tong District between April 2025 and March 2026  
(KTDC CICRC Paper No. 3/2025)**

15. The representative of LCSD presented the paper.

16. Members raised follow-up views and enquiries as follows:

16.1 Members noticed that the libraries had previously organised activities with themes related to the War of Resistance Against Japanese Aggression and Hong Kong's return to the Motherland, and suggested that LCSD provide relevant information to both Members and Care Teams.

16.2 Members enquired whether LCSD had organised any publicity and promotional activities for National Security Education Day or Constitution Day.

17. The representative of LCSD responded that it would continue to distribute promotional materials for activities to Members and Care Teams in the future to enhance promotional effectiveness. In addition, LCSD would hold a book display on national security education in the Lam Tin Public Library in April. Details of the event would be reported to Members.
