## **Opening Remarks**

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the National Education Promotion Committee (“NEPC”) and government representatives to the 5th meeting of NEPC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

### **I. Confirmation of Minutes of Last Meeting**

2. Members had no further comments or amendments and the minutes of the last meeting were confirmed.

### **II. Promoting National Education in Schools – Experience Sharing by Kwun Tong Government Secondary School (“KTGSS”)**

3. Principal IP shared the school’s experience in promoting national education, including organising National Security Education Day activities and exchange tours to the Mainland.

4. Members enquired whether the school had data indicating changes in students’ sense of national identity after participating in national education activities.

5. Principal IP said that the school would use the “Assessment Program for Affective and Social Outcomes” to assess the relevant learning outcomes of students, which included a subscale related to sense of national identity. The assessment results showed that students’ sense of belonging to the country and affection for the Chinese people had significantly improved compared to before, reflecting the effectiveness of the school’s efforts.

6. The Vice-chairman opined that the national education programme of KTGSS was very comprehensive and in-depth, and hoped that the school could share its experiences with other schools in the district.

7. The representative of the Education Bureau (“EDB”) responded that the bureau had always strongly encouraged schools to exchange ideas with one another. In addition to organising the “Love Our Home, Treasure Our Country 3.0” joint school national education activities, the bureau also regularly held sharing sessions on the promotion of national education.

8. The Chairman asked whether national education was a subject under the Hong Kong Diploma

of Secondary Education Examination.

9. The representative of EDB responded that a multi-pronged and co-ordinated approach had been adopted in schools to promote national education within and beyond the classroom, and relevant learning elements had been incorporated into various Key Learning Areas, relevant subjects, values education curriculum and life-wide learning activities. Although national education had not been implemented as an independent subject or included in public examinations, schools could assess the effectiveness of their national education efforts through diverse assessment methods, including students' daily assignments and post-activity reports.

10. Members noted the agenda item.

### **III. Activity for Promotion of National Education: Kwun Tong Chinese Cultural Fest - Celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the Founding of the People's Republic of China**

11. The representative of the Kwun Tong District Office ("KTDO") indicated that the activity was successfully held from 28 September to 1 October 2024. The event offered a wide range of activities, including food stalls, a cultural and creative market, and themed check-in spots featuring five provinces of China, attracting nearly 130 000 participants. KTDO thanked Members for their support of the event.

12. Members noted the agenda item.

### **IV. Any Other Business**

13. A Member stated that they were planning to organise an exchange tour to Shenzhen with the theme of celebrating the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China. The aim was to provide an opportunity for young people in Kwun Tong District to visit Shenzhen for exchanges, thereby deepening their understanding of the country's history and culture.

14. A Member mentioned that they were considering organising activities in collaboration with schools in Kwun Tong District to help students understand the operation of KTDC.

### **V. Date of Next Meeting**

15. The next meeting was scheduled to be held on 5 December 2024 (Thursday).

16. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:40 p.m.
