Opening Remarks

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the National Education Promotion Committee (“NEPC”) and government representatives to the 7th meeting of NEPC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

I. Confirmation of Minutes of Last Meeting

2. Members had no further comments or amendments and the minutes of the last meeting were confirmed.

II. The Latest Curriculum Development of Values Education in Primary and Secondary Schools

3. The representatives of the Curriculum Development Institute of the Education Bureau (“EDB”) introduced the values education curriculum in primary and secondary schools, which aimed to “cultivate values and nurture talents”. The introduction also covered the implementation strategies and the effectiveness of related promotional efforts. The curriculum was designed to cultivate proper values and attitudes among students through curricular and extracurricular learning experiences, preparing them to embrace future challenges and opportunities.

4. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

4.1 Members suggested organising film sharing sessions to create more opportunities for students and parents to spend time together.

4.2 Members proposed arranging school visits for them to gain a better understanding of the implementation of values education in schools.

5. The representative of EDB replied that the bureau had been organising diverse professional training programmes for teachers, including film appreciation and sharing sessions, to enhance their professional capacity in promoting values education. Furthermore, some non-governmental organisations had organised “Bringing Films to Schools” (in Chinese, “光影進校園”) activities, which allowed students to appreciate films at school, enhancing their understanding of national affairs and fostering patriotism.

6. The Vice-chairman pointed out that EDB should provide more training on values education for teachers and use the Assessment Program for Affective and Social Outcomes to evaluate the effectiveness of the values education curriculum.

7. The representative of EDB responded that promoting values education (including national education, patriotic education and national security education) was a crucial task for schools. In addition to updating curriculum guides and providing training for teachers, the bureau had also been organising diverse life-wide learning activities for students, such as thematic seminars, exchange programmes and study tours to the Mainland, to strengthen their sense of nationhood and national identity. Regarding curriculum effectiveness assessment, schools would use the assessment program for self-evaluation. EDB also sought to understand the implementation of values education in schools through different channels, such as inspections, curriculum development visits and daily communication, and issued guidelines in a timely manner to support schools.

8. Members noted the agenda item.

III. Activity for Promotion of National Education - Kwun Tong District Constitution and Basic Law Fun Day

9. The representative of the Kwun Tong District Office (“KTDO”) reported that the event had been successfully held on 7 December 2024. The event featured a variety of activities, including booth games, magic shows and stand-up comedy performances, all themed around the Constitution

and the Basic Law. KTDO expressed its gratitude to Members for their support of the event.

10. Members noted the agenda item.
