### **Opening Remarks**

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the National Education Promotion Committee (“NEPC”) and government representatives to the 9th meeting of NEPC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

#### **I. Confirmation of Minutes of Last Meeting**

2. Members had no further comments or amendments and the minutes of the last meeting were confirmed.

#### **II. Sharing by the Centre of National History Education (“CNHE”) on Promoting National Education**

3. The representative of CNHE introduced the background and activities of the Centre, as well as its experience in collaborating with schools and the community to promote Chinese history and culture.

4. Members enquired about the age group of students targeted by the Centre’s national education efforts.

5. The representative of CHNE responded that their work primarily focused on primary and secondary school students, and they had been actively expanding services to kindergartens in recent years.

6. Members suggested incorporating elements of daily life into national education, along with explanations of the origins of various Chinese customs.

7. The representative of CHNE stated that the Centre would include information on intangible cultural heritage in its curriculum and enrich the courses with more engaging content.

8. Members noted the agenda item.

### **III. Promoting National Education in Schools – Experience Sharing by Jordan Valley St. Joseph’s Catholic Primary School**

9. Principal Tsang of Jordan Valley St. Joseph’s Catholic Primary School shared the school’s experience in promoting national education, including organising activities for National Security Education Day and Mainland exchange tours.

10. Members suggested that the school could encourage students to participate in national education activities through rewards.

11. Principal Tsang shared that the school had launched a reward scheme allowing students to record their participation in school activities throughout the year via an electronic platform, with the aim of encouraging them to explore diverse experiences and engage in self-directed learning.

12. Members enquired which grade levels of students were eligible to join the Mainland exchange tours.

13. The representative of the Education Bureau responded that when planning overseas study tours, schools must consider the capabilities of participants in selecting destinations and designing itineraries. Principal Tsang added that his school had organised Mainland exchange tours for Primary 4 and Primary 6 students.

14. Members noted the agenda item.

### **IV. Any Other Business**

15. The representative of the Kwun Tong District Office introduced the Hong Kong Excellent Family Awards, jointly organised by the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau and the Family Council.

16. Members did not raise any other business.

### **V. Date of Next Meeting**

17. The next meeting was scheduled to be held on 31 July 2025 (Thursday).

18. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:40 p.m.
