### **Opening Remarks**

The Chairlady welcomed all attendees to the 11th meeting of the Social Welfare and Women Development Committee (“SWWDC”) under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

#### **I. Confirmation of Minutes of Last Meeting**

2. Members did not raise any other comments. The minutes of the 10th meeting were confirmed.

#### **II. “Smart Silver” Digital Inclusion Programme for Elders (KTDC SWWDC Paper No. 6/2025)**

3. The representatives of the Digital Policy Office (“DPO”) and the Hong Kong Society for the Aged (“SAGE”) introduced the “Smart Silver” Digital Inclusion Programme for Elders (“Smart Silver Programme”).

4. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

- 4.1 Members expressed support for the Smart Silver Programme, and hoped that its service coverage could be expanded to benefit more elderly persons.
  - 4.2 Members suggested that the courses be offered repeatedly to help the elderly become familiar with digital technology.
  - 4.3 Members enquired about the coverage of outreach services, and suggested making good use of DC Members' ward offices as service points to facilitate the participation of elderly persons in the courses.
  - 4.4 Members suggested providing training for district volunteers at DC Members' ward offices so that they could serve as instructors to teach the elderly how to use digital technology.
5. The representative of DPO agreed that, when learning digital technology, the elderly needed repeated practice to strengthen their memory and become familiar with the skills. Therefore, the implementing organisations would regularly organise training courses for them.
6. The representative of SAGE responded to Members' views and enquiries as follows:
- 6.1 SAGE would provide outreach services and on-site technical support. Should Members have any suggestions regarding service provision, for example, one-to-one support services or arranging for volunteers to be on duty at DC Members' ward offices, they may complete the application form provided by SAGE. Upon receipt of applications, SAGE would make appropriate arrangements according to circumstances.
  - 6.2 SAGE would also organise regular volunteer training, and was willing to provide the relevant training for volunteers at DC Members' ward offices.
7. Members noted the relevant matters.

### **III. Service Introduction of Hong Kong Society for Rehabilitation**

8. The representatives of the Hong Kong Society for Rehabilitation ("HKSR") introduced the organisation's services and the progress of the Lam Tin Complex redevelopment project.

9. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
  - 9.1 Members enquired about the funding sources of the Lam Tin Complex redevelopment project and whether HKSR would adjust service fees in the future.
  - 9.2 Members enquired about the details of the “Community Rehabilitation Network”.
10. The representative of HKSR responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:
  - 10.1 The representative of HKSR stated that the redevelopment project fell under the “Special Scheme on Privately Owned Sites for Welfare Uses” and was mainly funded by the Government and the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust.
  - 10.2 The representative of HKSR explained that the organisation currently provided both government-funded services and self-financing services. For the funded services, HKSR was required to charge service users the recognised fees stipulated by the Social Welfare Department (“SWD”), and SWD would review the fees from time to time. Fees for the self-financing services were adjusted and arranged according to HKSR’s established mechanisms. HKSR would make good use of the funding received to provide services for those in need.
  - 10.3 The representative of HKSR stated that the “Community Rehabilitation Network” was a service subvented by SWD, which aimed to help patients with chronic illnesses establish mutual support networks.
11. Members urged HKSR to fully communicate with local stakeholders regarding specific details of the redevelopment project, such as the construction timetable, building height, and impact on surrounding traffic.
12. The representative of HKSR responded that the redevelopment project was still at the detailed design stage. HKSR would maintain communication with DC Members and relevant stakeholders, and would report on the project progress in due course.
13. Members enquired about the details of the “Self-help Organisations Resource Centre”.
14. The representative of HKSR explained that the “Self-help Organisations Resource Centre” mainly provided support for self-help organisations formed by patients with chronic illnesses, persons with disabilities, or parents’ associations, including the provision of low-cost training

courses and facilities such as shared office space.

15. Members noted the relevant matters.

18. The representative of SWD introduced the latest progress of the relocation plan of SAHK LOHAS Garden, including SWD's decision to designate two new rehabilitation facility developments located in other districts for the permanent reprovisioning of LOHAS Garden.
