Opening Remarks

The Chairlady welcomed all Members of the Social Welfare and Women Development Committee (“SWWDC”) and government representatives to the 13th meeting of SWWDC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

I. Confirmation of Minutes of Last Meeting

2. Members did not raise any other comments. The minutes of the 12th meeting were confirmed.

II. Service Introduction of “Support and Care for Elderly Persons and their Carers” by Christian Family Service Centre

3. The representatives of the Christian Family Service Centre (“CFSC”) briefed Members on the services provided by the organisation.

4. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

4.1 Members enquired about the service boundaries of the four District Elderly Community Centres (“DECCs”) in Kwun Tong District, and suggested that the DECCs strengthen communication and collaboration with District Council Members and Care Teams.

4.2 Members enquired whether CFSC could provide longer-term residential respite service in

cases where carers were unable to fulfil their caring responsibilities due to emergencies.

5. The representative of the Social Welfare Department (“SWD”) responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:

5.1 There were currently four DECCs in Kwun Tong District, namely the CFSC True Light Villa DECC, the CFSC Shun On DECC, the Hong Kong Christian Service Bliss DECC, and the Po Leung Kuk Lau Chan Siu Po DECC. Each centre provided services to the elderly within its respective service boundary.

5.2 If carers needed to use residential respite services, they could call the 24-hour Designated Hotline for Carer Support 182 183 (“Hotline”). The Hotline would match persons in need with suitable residential respite services and arrange for social workers to follow up on the cases. In addition, SWD had earlier launched a “pilot scheme” in collaboration with the Hospital Authority (“HA”). Under this scheme, when high-risk carers were admitted to hospital, HA would notify SWD to arrange for the Hotline and relevant service units to proactively reach out to their care recipients and provide emergency support according to their needs, including residential respite services.

6. The representative of CFSC further explained that residents in need could first contact any of the DECCs in Kwun Tong District, and the social workers of the centre would assist in referring the case to the corresponding DECC.

7. Members noted the matter.

III. SWD – Report on the data on major social services in Kwun Tong District (KTDC Swwdc Paper No. 01/2026)

8. The representative of SWD presented the paper.

9. Members enquired about the specific arrangements for applying for medical fee waivers through SWD.

10. The representative of SWD responded that patients attending follow-up consultations at Family Medicine Clinics could apply for medical fee waivers through SWD’s Integrated Family Service Centres.

IV. Any Other Business

11. Members raised no other items for discussion.

V. Date of Next Meeting

12. The next meeting was scheduled to be held on 26 March 2026 (Thursday) at 2:30 p.m.

13. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:29 p.m.
