6. The Chairman enquired about the qualifications and attributes required of young people aspiring to become surveyors.

The representative of HKIS explained that graduates of surveying degrees recognised by HKIS were eligible to apply to enter HKIS's Assessment of Professional Competence to obtain the qualification as a surveyor. Additionally, young people aspiring to become surveyors should demonstrate a meticulous, prudent and impartial attitude towards work, as well as professionalism.
8. The Vice-chairman hoped that HKIS would continue to liaise and strengthen cooperation with KTDC to promote young people's career development.
9. The Chairman expressed gratitude to the representatives of HKIS for attending the meeting.

IV. Report on Youth Crimes in Kwun Tong District from May to June 2025
(KTDC YC Paper No. 8/2025)

13. The representative of the Hong Kong Police Force ("HKPF") presented the paper.
14. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
 - 14.1 Members enquired about HKPF's plan to disseminate crime prevention messages to young people during the summer holiday, and suggested that HKPF provide information on scams to young people to prevent them from falling into employment traps.
 - 14.2 Members expressed concern about the rising trend in youth crime figures of Sau Mau Ping District.

14.3 Members suggested that HKPF strengthen collaboration with various departments to provide more support for young people.

15. The representative of HKPF responded to Members' views and enquiries as follows:

Kwun Tong District

15.1 Dissemination of crime prevention messages: The Kwun Tong District of HKPF had organised talks in schools in the district before the summer holiday, explaining various employment traps and scams to students to prevent them from inadvertently breaching the law.

15.2 Interdepartmental collaboration: The representative of HKPF stated that the police would actively consider Members' suggestions.

Sau Mau Ping District

15.3 Summer activities: The Junior Police Call ("JPC") of Sau Mau Ping District of HKPF had previously arranged for local youths to participate in Mainland exchange tours and activities at the Whampoa Military Academy to enhance their understanding of the nation. Additionally, JPC would organise interest classes during the summer holiday and promote crime prevention messages to young people through these activities.

15.4 Crime figures: The Sau Mau Ping District of HKPF had handled several cases involving fraud, drugs, criminal intimidation and wounding from May to June. The police had collaborated with local organisations to hold crime prevention talks and activities to prevent young people from inadvertently breaching the law.

16. Members suggested that HKPF strengthen its publicity efforts to raise parents' awareness of the harmful effects of etomidate.

17. The representative of HKPF stated that the police had organised talks in collaboration with local organisations in June this year, providing parents in the district with information about etomidate. Furthermore, the police expressed their willingness to cooperate with DC Members to publicise the dangers of etomidate.

18. Members noted the paper.

19. Members did not raise other items for discussion.
