Opening Remarks

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Youth Committee (“YC”) and government representatives to the 13th meeting of YC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

2. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had received notices of absence from Mr TANG Wing-chun and Mr LAW Kwok-ho before the meeting. YC consented to the above two applications for absence due to their compliance with Order 64 (1) of the Kwun Tong District Council Standing Orders.

I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 12th Meeting of Youth Committee

3. The Secretariat had earlier circulated the draft minutes of the last meeting to all Members. Members had not raised any other comments before and during the meeting. The minutes of the 12th meeting were confirmed.

II. Visit of the Future Diplomats Academy to the Youth Committee under Kwun Tong District Council

4. The representative of the Future Diplomats Academy (“FDA”) introduced the background of FDA and promoted the “Young Diplomats” programme.

5. The Vice-chairman enquired about the qualifications of the instructors of the “Young Diplomats” programme and how participants were recruited.

6. The representative of FDA responded that the instructors of the “Young Diplomats” programme included university lecturers and DC Members. As for the recruitment arrangements, FDA had earlier issued invitations to schools in Kwun Tong and Wong Tai Sin districts, and a total of 36 students from nine schools in the two districts were ultimately nominated to participate in the programme. FDA would continue to promote diplomatic education in schools in the district.

7. The Chairman commended the vision and activities of FDA and thanked the representative of FDA for attending the meeting.

8. Members noted the agenda item.

9. The representative of the Education Bureau presented the paper.

IV. Report on Youth Crimes in Kwun Tong District from November to December 2025
(KTDC YC Paper No. 2/2026)

11. The representative of the Hong Kong Police Force (“HKPF”) presented the paper.

12. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

12.1 Members expressed concern about the sale or free provision of liquor to young people at Kwun Tong Promenade (“the Promenade”).

12.2 Members suggested that HKPF step up crime prevention publicity efforts targeting young people.

13. The representative of HKPF responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:

13.1 Enforcement operations at the Promenade: The Kwun Tong District, Sau Mau Ping District and Police Tactical Unit of HKPF would strengthen patrols at the Promenade

during festive periods. The Miscellaneous Enquiries Sub-unit of HKPF would also investigate whether nearby shops sold liquor to minors.

13.2 Crime prevention publicity: During festive periods, HKPF would, in collaboration with the Junior Police Call, distribute national security and anti-drug promotional leaflets to young people at the Promenade.

14. Members noted the paper.

15. Members did not raise other items for discussion.
