**Opening Remarks**

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Youth Committee (“YC”) and government representatives to the 1st meeting of YC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

2. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had received notices of absence from Mr CHEUNG Ki-tang, Mr NG Sing-wah, Mr LIN Ho-man and Ms CHU Lok-wai before the meeting. Since the applications of Mr NG, Mr LIN and Ms CHU were in compliance with Order 64(1) of the Kwun Tong District Council Standing Orders, YC consented to the above three applications for absence.

**I. Brief Introduction on Youth Education Work by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (“ICAC”)**

3. The representative of ICAC gave an introduction on the relevant work.

4. The Chairman enquired about the details of the Youth Chapter under the ICAC Club and whether the Youth Chapter would consider collaborating with KTDC.

5. The representative of ICAC responded that the ICAC Club was a voluntary organisation that promoted anti-corruption and other positive values in the community mainly through organising

activities. Members of the Youth Chapter of the ICAC Club included students and working people. If time permitted, ICAC would be pleased to facilitate collaboration between the ICAC Club and KTDC.

6. Members enquired about the resources allocated in family education by ICAC and whether it had any plan to collaborate with Care Teams.

7. The representative of ICAC responded that schools and parent-teacher associations were welcome to utilise resources from ICAC's "Moral Education Bookshelf" for organising parent-child activities. ICAC had also previously organised thematic seminars for parents from time to time. ICAC would try to explore different collaborating partners to deepen the culture of integrity in the district.

8. The Chairman thanked ICAC for the introduction and hoped that KTDC and ICAC could strengthen collaboration in the future to promote the message of integrity and youth work.

## **II. Future Work Direction of the Committee**

9. The Chairman presented the terms of reference of YC. He hoped that youth organisations in the district could be invited to future meetings to introduce their work. Also, the Chairman hoped that YC could assist the Kwun Tong District Youth Development and Civic Education Committee and the Kwun Tong District Youth Community Building Committee in promoting youth work.

10. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:

10.1 Members suggested discussing youth work in four aspects, namely education, employment, home ownership and entrepreneurship.

10.2 Members hoped that the Kwun Tong District Office ("KTDO") would clarify the positioning of YC and its relationship with the two Kwun Tong District Youth Committees.

10.3 Members enquired about the resources allocated to YC and proposed organising activities such as cross-boundary exchanges and visits, internship programmes, life planning activities and entrepreneurial competitions. They also suggested allocating funds to support young people in the district to participate in small-scale entrepreneurial activities.

- 10.4 Members suggested that YC should visit schools and youth centres in the district to enhance communication with young people and understand their needs.
- 10.5 Members enquired about the number of youth centres and related facilities in Kwun Tong District.
- 10.6 Members suggested that YC should arrange for students to participate in the school exhibition organised by the Kwun Tong Schools Liaison Committee to enable them to know more about the schools in the district and obtain information on further studies.
- 10.7 Members suggested that Members of YC be divided into groups to discuss youth policies and issues, with a view to catering for the needs of young people in different age groups.
- 10.8 Members suggested discussing issues about youth mental health during YC meetings.
- 10.9 Members suggested that more information on venues should be provided to young people, such as the methods and conditions for hiring government venues, so as to encourage them to hold activities.
- 10.10 Members suggested that YC should strengthen collaboration with different tertiary institutions and youth organisations in the district to encourage more youth participation in activities, while also promoting the government's youth policies to them.

11. The Chairman summarised Members' suggestions, including: discussing youth work in four aspects, organising cross-boundary exchange activities, strengthening collaboration with different committees, providing more information to young people, encouraging young people to participate in the work of YC, and discussing youth work by grouping according to age or specific issues. Also, the Chairman suggested inviting the Hong Kong Police Force to share anti-drug information with young people and inviting non-governmental organisations to share mental health information. The Chairman encouraged Members to provide contact information of youth organisations they were familiar with and assist in inviting the relevant organisations to attend meetings to enhance collaboration.

12. The representative of KTDO responded to Members' views and enquiries as follows:

- 12.1 Youth work: KTDO primarily focused its resources on helping young people in two aspects, namely employment and entrepreneurship, and had been providing relevant

support to young people. For instance, KTDO organised the Life Planning and Internship Programme 2023 last year to provide young people with internship opportunities in various industries such as banking and hospitality. Also, KTDO organised cross-territory visits, such as a study tour to Hangzhou in December last year.

12.2 Activity resources: KTDO said that although YC had not been allocated resources for organising carnivals, exhibitions on further studies, exchange tours and other activities, KTDO would consider organising relevant activities based on the suggestions of Members.

12.3 Positioning of YC: KTDO encouraged Members to interact more with young people and pointed out that the District Youth Community Building Committee had been conducting community surveys. He suggested that YC collaborates with the committee to understand the needs of youth in the district more comprehensively. Also, KTDO would consider providing Members with contact information of the youth organisations in the district to facilitate YC's planning of youth work.

13. The Chairman concluded that YC mainly played an advisory role, providing views on youth matters to assist the Government in strengthening relevant work. In addition, YC could invite various youth organisations to meetings to give presentations on their youth work.

### **III. Any Other Business**

14. Members did not raise other items for discussion.

### **IV. Date of Next Meeting**

15. The next meeting was scheduled to be held at 2:30 p.m. on 2 April 2024 (Tuesday).

16. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:32 p.m.
