Opening Remarks

The Chairman welcomed all Members of the Youth Committee (“YC”) and government representatives to the 9th meeting of YC under the 7th Term Kwun Tong District Council (“KTDC”).

2. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had not received any notice of absence from Members before the meeting.

I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 8th Meeting of YC

3. The Secretariat had earlier circulated the draft minutes of the last meeting to all Members. Members had not raised any other comments before and during the meeting. The minutes of the 8th meeting were confirmed.

II. Introduction to Youth Services of Yan Oi Tong

4. The Chairman welcomed the representatives of Yan Oi Tong to the meeting.

5. The representatives of Yan Oi Tong introduced two services, namely “YOT Hub” and “Yan Oi Tong Youth Space” (“Youth Space”).

6. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
 - 6.1 Members enquired about the details of the requirement to complete 200 “STAY FUN” hours under the Youth Hostel Scheme.
 - 6.2 Members enquired about the goals that Yan Oi Tong expected youth tenants to achieve through their stay at YOT Hub.
 - 6.3 Members enquired about the funding model for YOT Hub.
7. The representative of Yan Oi Tong responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:
 - 7.1 “STAY FUN” hours and accommodation goals: The Home and Youth Affairs Bureau (“HYAB”) required youth tenants to accumulate 200 “STAY FUN” hours within one year. Meanwhile, Yan Oi Tong hoped that youth tenants could achieve self-enrichment and broaden their personal and social networks during their stay at the hostel, preparing them for the challenges later in life.
 - 7.2 Funding model: The representative of Yan Oi Tong stated that the Government provided funding to support Yan Oi Tong’s collaboration with Regal Oriental Hotel to use some of the hotel rooms for youth hostel purposes. In addition, the hotel offered free cleaning services and laundry services at half price to the youth tenants.
8. The Vice-chairman enquired whether the requirement on youth tenants’ net assets was set by HYAB.
9. The representative of Yan Oi Tong responded that the total net asset limit was established in accordance with HYAB’s requirements.
10. The Chairman enquired about the details of Yan Oi Tong’s operation of Youth Space in other districts.
11. The representative of Yan Oi Tong stated that Youth Space was initially established under the “Tuen Mun District Signature Project Scheme – Promotion of Youth Development” funded by the Tuen Mun District Council. To enhance the participation of young people across different districts, Yan Oi Tong started expanding the project to other districts in 2023. Yan Oi Tong hoped to collaborate and share experiences with various organisations in Kwun Tong District.

12. The Chairman thanked the representatives of Yan Oi Tong for attending the meeting.
13. Members noted the agenda item.

III. Number of Children Referred to Public Sector Primary and Secondary Schools in Kwun Tong District Provided by the Education Bureau (“EDB”) (KTDC YC Paper No. 5/2025)

14. The representative of EDB presented the paper.
15. Members noted the paper.

IV. Report on Youth Crimes in Kwun Tong District from March to April 2025 (KTDC YC Paper No. 6/2025)

16. The representatives of the Hong Kong Police Force (“HKPF”) presented the paper.
17. Members raised views and enquiries as follows:
 - 17.1 Members expressed concern about the recent arrests of youths in Yau Lai Estate for possession of cocaine and e-cigarettes, and asked for further details.
 - 17.2 Members suggested that HKPF analyse crime data to understand whether the causes of youth crime were related to family or other social factors.
18. The representatives of HKPF responded to Members’ views and enquiries as follows:
 - 18.1 Yau Lai Estate case: The representative of HKPF stated that a response would be provided after the meeting.

(Post-meeting note: According to police information, Yau Lai Estate was not considered a blackspot for drug trafficking. The Police would continue to combat drug-related criminal activities in the district.)
 - 18.2 Crime analysis: The Police would continue to analyse youth crime across different age groups and strengthen the dissemination of anti-crime messages to parents as well as primary and secondary schools in the district through various channels, with a view to

preventing youth crime at an early stage.

19. Members noted the paper.

V. Any Other Business

20. The Secretary introduced the Hong Kong Excellent Family Awards (“Awards”) jointly organised by HYAB and the Family Council and invited Members to assist in promoting the activity.

21. The Chairman enquired about how publicity materials for the Awards could be obtained, and encouraged Members to actively promote and participate in the activity.

22. The Secretary responded that the publicity materials for the Awards could be obtained online.

VI. Date of Next Meeting

23. The next meeting was scheduled to be held at 2:30 p.m. on 29 July 2025 (Tuesday).

24. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:11 p.m.
