- C. To organize the district-based Age-Friendly Summit annually.
- D. Participating in the Age-Friendly Hong Kong Steering Committee

1) Age-friendly Hong Kong (Sai Kung) Working Group

- a. <u>The captioned working group will be formed under the Social Services &</u> <u>Healthy and Safe City Committee of Sai Kung District Council. The total number</u> <u>of members, including those who will be in attendance, will be around 15</u> <u>persons.</u>
- b. <u>The working group is targeted to have not less than 1/4 members (including those who will be in attendance) of the age 60 or above. That will be around 4 persons.</u>
- c. <u>The selection of seniors' representatives is by effective nomination from NGOs.</u> <u>The operational mechanism is devised through group discussion.</u>
- d. <u>The working group will invite government departments</u>, NGOs and older <u>persons to be in attendance at the meetings</u>.

2) AFC Ambassadors for Age-friendly Hong Kong (Sai Kung)

- a. Arrange capacity building opportunities for the AFC ambassadors
- **b.** Empower the AFC ambassadors to fulfill their role in conducting the Age-friendly Community Assessment according to the eight domains
- c. Empower the AFC ambassadors in the Action Plan and Target Planning
- 3) Sai Kung District : Good Community Practice on Age-Friendly Hong Kong
 - a. <u>A "locally-driven" and "bottom-up" approach that starts with the views of older</u> people regarding what is, and what is not age-friendly, and what could be done to improve their community's age-friendliness.

4) District-based Age-Friendly Forum/ Summit

- a. Organize the forum/summit once a year
- b. Engage the AFC ambassadors in the organization of forum/ summit




