

**Sai Kung District Council**  
**Education, Health and Social Welfare Committee**  
**Progress Report of the Age-Friendly City Working Group**

The second meeting (2022) of the Age-Friendly City Working Group under the Education, Health and Social Welfare Committee of the Sai Kung District Council was held on 11 October 2022. The major issues discussed at the meeting were summarised as follows:

Concern over traffic problems near King Yin Lane

2. Members noted the written replies from the Transport Department (TD) and the Highways Department (HyD).
3. The Working Group agreed to refer the captioned matter to the Traffic and Transport Committee (TTC) for follow-up work.

Traffic accident black spot at the junction of Mau Yip Road and Mau Tai Road

4. The Working Group agreed to refer the captioned matter to TTC for follow-up on the progress of enhancement works.

Concern over the danger of the waiting location of the minibus stand (e.g. route nos. 10M, 107) outside Po Lam MTR Station

5. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views to TD in writing.

Concern over the impact of construction of public housing at Yau Yue Wan Village Road on residents nearby

6. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views to the Civil Engineering and Development Department, Environmental Protection Department, Housing Department (HD) and TD in writing.

Construction of a pavilion on Duckling Hill

7. Members noted the progress of follow-up on the captioned matter.

Provision of distance posts at the foot of Duckling Hill

Provision of a lift at the "Yellow Bridge" in Tsui Lam Estate

Improving the unevenness of the road crossing in King Lam Estate off King Lam Neighbourhood Community Centre

19. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views to the Incorporated Owners and Management Office of King Lam Estate in writing.

Improving the wear and tear of the tactile guide path near King Min House, King Lam Estate

20. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views to the Incorporated Owners and Management Office of King Lam Estate in writing.

Concern over the uneven surface of the pavement off King Yung House, King Lam Estate due to exposed tree roots, which forms a tripping hazard to the elderly

21. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views to HyD and the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) in writing, and hoped to conduct a site inspection at the location concerned with the two departments.

Provision of public toilets along the Tseung Kwan O waterfront (on sections from Oscar by the Sea to LOHAS Park)

22. The Working Group agreed to reflect Members' views by writing to the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD), HyD, LCSD and SKDO.

Concern over medication, daily necessities and emotional support for the elderly amid the epidemic

Enquiry about the construction progress of a Neighbourhood Elderly Centre in LOHAS Park

Hygiene problems caused by wild pigeons congregating near MTR Po Lam Station

Concern about the large number of wild pigeons foraging near MTR Hang Hau Station that the bird droppings may cause hygiene problems

Poor hygiene of the pond in King Lam Estate
