Sai Kung District Office (SKDO) assists to implement, -

(A) District Council

To continue providing support to the work of Sai Kung District Council (SKDC), including encouraging community involvement, proposing district minor works and managing local facilities such as community halls etc.

(B) District Management Committee (DMC)

To coordinate the concerted efforts of government departments in enhancing the provision of cross-departmental services in the districts and in tackling and resolving district issues proactively in response to local district needs. The DMC will continue to lead relevant departments in following up projects under the District-led Actions Scheme (DAS). The DMC will decide on the specific details of DAS projects in consultation with the SKDC, with a view to proactively addressing district issues that require immediate attention having regard to district situation.

(C) Area Committee

To support the Area Committees and to encourage them to provide views on various local issues and organise activities.

TKO Heritage Post was officially opened in December 2021 and was opened to the public in December 2022. InnSpired Heritage would commence service shortly.

2. Community and Welfare Service

Objective

Programmes Planned for 2023-24

Social Welfare Department

(A) Family and Child Welfare Service

- To promote family harmony and strengthen family cohesion as well as to facilitate families to face positively the adversity and stresses brought about by the epidemic
- To early identify and provide timely support to deprived families and families-at-risk
- To combat domestic violence and enhance child protection

(B) Rehabilitation Service

- To strengthen support for persons with disabilities and their family members /carers and to enhance their physical and psychological wellbeing.

- (1) Wong Tai Sin and Sai Kung District Social Welfare Office (DSWO), together with the district stakeholders, will continue to implement the “Happy Living Community Campaign”. Through extensive promotion of the positive psychology concept on “Great-life”, the Campaign aims at establishing positive strength in the community and enhancing residents’ positivity and resilience in face of adversity and stress brought about by the epidemic.
 - (2) The four Integrated Family Service Centres (IFSCs) in Sai Kung will continue to provide various welfare services including preventive, supportive and remedial services for people in the community through different approaches so as to promote family harmony and family cohesion, as well as to early identify those deprived families and families-at-risk and provide them with timely support.
 - (3) In supporting the Government’s proposal to establish a mandatory reporting mechanism on child abuse cases through legislation and to enhance training for related professionals on early identification of child abuse, IFSCs and the Family and Child Protective Service Unit in the district will provide preventive, supportive and specialised remedial services to victims and families in need, as well as to combat family violence through publicity and public education. Multi-disciplinary seminars and workshops on early identifying child abuse will be organised in the district to strengthen assessment competence and collaboration among professionals in child protection work.
- (1) Through collaboration with rehabilitation service units in the district and the publication of district-based biannual newsletters, DSWO will continue sharing the latest development and availability of various new services and community resources with local residents, persons with disabilities and their family members / caregivers, and foster their awareness of various types of rehabilitation and carer support services in the district. Besides, DSWO would, through different publicity measures and campaigns, further enhance the information and awareness of carer support services, arouse public awareness on the needs of carers, and enhance their physical as well as psychological wellbeing.

2. Community and Welfare Service

Objective

Programmes Planned for 2023-24

- To strengthen support for people with mental health/emotional problems and to enhance the service quality of frontline caseworkers
- To promote integration of persons with disabilities into the community

- (2) Through strengthening collaboration between Integrated Community Centres for Mental Wellness and different service units in the district, DSWO aims at having early identification of needy persons in their mental recovery and people with mental health/emotional problems, especially families and students with higher mental health risks in the district, so as to provide them with appropriate support and care. DSWO will continue to organise workshops and sharing sessions to enhance frontline caseworkers' knowledge and skills in serving the above service targets.
- (3) Through collaborating with rehabilitation service units, local organisations and stakeholders, DSWO will continue to enhance the public understanding and acceptance of persons with disabilities and to build a caring, inclusive and equal community by showcasing the multi-facet talents and capabilities of persons with disabilities, including their artistic aptitude and application of information technology, for their daily living.

(C) Elderly Service

- To encourage elderly to take active part in community activities, promote positive psychology and resilience, and to take forward the work of "Promoting Elderly's Sense of Worthiness"
- To early identify and support elderly in need in the community, promote mutual help and build up neighborhood support

- (1) DSWO will continue to implement the "Opportunities for the Elderly Project" to encourage elderly to participate actively in community activities, unleash their potentials, further their contribution to society and actualise the motto of "living lives to the fullest"; to enrich elderly's knowledge in health management, emotional management, exercise skills, etc., and to enhance positive thinking and resilience in tackling different life stressors.
- (2) Through district collaborative projects, community education, training activities, etc., DSWO will endeavor in early identification of hidden and needy elders, including those who are frail, physically impaired, with dementia or other care needs, and their caregivers, and at the same time raising public awareness of the needs of carers through publicity activities and campaign. To build up neighborhood support network and promote community-based peer support for carers, DSWO will encourage elderly service units in the district to mobilise elders to become volunteers and to serve other elders in need through telephone calls, concern visits and other activities.
- (3) DSWO will collaborate with elderly service units to organise training and sharing sessions etc. for their frontline social workers to enhance their skills and knowledge in handling

- network
- To enhance the career development and sharing of practice wisdom and skills among frontline elderly service workers in the district so as to support elderly and carers in need

elders' and carers' emotional problems and conflict scenarios so as to achieve early identification of complicated cases and provide them with timely support.

(D) Children and Youth Service

- To facilitate young people to become responsible and contributing members of the society
- To enhance support to youth-at-risk and youth suffering from emotional disturbances
- To prevent and reduce offending behaviour of children and youth

(1) To promote young people's social participation and strengthen their sense of belonging to the community, the Sai Kung Youth Collaboration Preparatory Committee implemented "Youth Maker 4.0 –堅滾吧！ “職人の殿堂” in 2022-2023. The Committee plans to further promote career and life development in the coming year through organisation of joint programmes in the district.

(2) DSWO concerns about the mental wellness and stresses of the youth in facing the increasing complicated family problems and the epidemic. Through the "The Referral Mechanism of Health and Emotion Support Service for Adolescents", community service units will continue to collaborate with Tseung Kwan O Hospital Community Adolescent Specialist Clinic for social workers to refer adolescents with emotional disturbances for early medical diagnosis and treatment.

(3) In light of the increase in delinquent behaviour and young people's involvement in serious crime, DSWO will continue to enhance the support network and professional collaboration with local stakeholders including Police, Education Bureau, School Liaison Committee, Parent-Teacher Association and youth service units to render support to youths at risk as well as their families at an early stage. DSWO will collaborate with local stakeholders to strengthen the understanding of adverse impacts of drug abuse and support for needy young people and their families in accordance with the strategic directions of the "Three-Year Plan for Drug Treatment and Rehabilitation Services in Hong Kong (2021-2023)" of the

Narcotics Division.

(E) Social Security Service

- To merge the Normal and Higher Old Age Living Allowance (OALA)

(1) The Normal and Higher OALA was merged with effect from 1 September 2022. The combined allowance with the monthly payment set at the payment rate of Higher OALA and the more lenient asset limits of the Normal OALA will be adopted across-the-board under OALA.

(F) Community Collaboration and Promotion of Volunteer Services

- To mobilise community resources in service collaboration and strengthen mutual support in the neighbourhood
- To encourage collaboration of residents, community and corporations to participate in community service
- To promote volunteerism and spirit of mutual care and support in the community

(1) To achieve early identification of needy residents for early intervention to address their welfare needs, DSWO will continue to promote collaborated effort amongst various local stakeholders including NGOs, management offices and owners' committees of private residential buildings, etc. through platforms like the "Tsui Lam Service Collaboration Alliance" and the "Tseung Kwan O (South) Community Collaboration Network" ("The Network").

(2) DSWO and "The Network" will continue to promote the message of "Good Persons and Good Deeds" for strengthening the cohesion and positivity of residents and community members. Through awarding "Good Persons and Good Deeds" and presenting the related good deeds by means of video clips, the message of "Good Persons and Good Deeds" will be infiltrated into every corner of the community.

(3) DSWO will continue to conduct training activities for staff members who are responsible for volunteer management and experienced volunteers of social service organisations, local organisations and schools in Sai Kung district to enhance skills on developing and consolidating commitment of volunteers to face new challenges in volunteer service. DSWO will award and commend volunteers at district level for their contribution to the community and to encourage more people to participate in volunteer services.

5.2 Environmental Protection Department

The Environmental Protection Department (EPD) is mainly responsible for enforcing environmental legislations, implementing policies on environmental protection, and handling pollution complaints in Sai Kung District through its Regional Office (East). Besides, in order to facilitate environmental compliance, EPD has established partnership programmes with trades and offered assistance and advice on compliance related matters. Moreover, activities are also organised with District Councils and local communities to promote public awareness and concern for environmental matters.

Action Plan for Sai Kung District

EPD will continue to keep a close watch on pollution problems in the district. Our primary action items are as follows:

Item 1 : To enforce environmental legislation.

Target : To implement control over polluters by enforcing environmental protection legislation; and to manage and monitor pollution problems in the district through different permit and licensing systems.

Item 2 : To address community needs and handle pollution complaints.

Target : To provide prompt response to enquiries and complaints about pollution in the district through a hotline service; to conduct investigation under our purview and prosecute offenders.

Item 3 : To partner with various trades in promoting environmental compliance.

Target : To form partnership with trades and to enhance their knowledge on environmental protection and promote environmental compliance through seminars, guidelines or liaison meetings.

Item 4 : To arouse public awareness on environmental protection.

Target : To promote waste reduction and recycling through Green Outreach and to arouse public awareness of environmental protection through collaboration with local communities.

Priority Items for 2023-24

- To conduct various anti-flytipping measures in the district including ambush operations to flytipping hotspots for around 8 times a month and installation of CCTV surveillance cameras at strategic locations;
- To arouse awareness of heavy vehicle drivers on environmental hygiene issues through displaying education banners along Wan Po Road and distributing leaflet at entrance of the extended SENT landfill;

- To provide residents with community recycling support and environmental education activities, the Recycling Station GREEN@SAI KUNG in Po Lam Lane, Recycling Stores GREEN@PO LAM in MCP Central, GREEN@SAI KUNG TOWN in Man Nin Street, Sai Kung and its Tiu Keng Leng Branch in Ocean Shores have commenced operation separately between August 2021 and January 2023;
- Green Outreach will continue to establish and maintain effective communication network with the stakeholders in the community, including property management companies, frontline cleansing workers, resident organisations and local community organisations, so as to support the waste separation at source and clean recycling work and provide appropriate assistance to find the outlets for recyclables. Green Outreach will also promote the EPD's waste reduction and recycling related measures to raise the public's concern and participation in waste reduction and recycling.

As set out in the 2022 Policy Address, Tseung Kwan O Area 137 will be developed into a new community primarily for housing purpose, providing about 50 000 residential units for a total population of around 135 000. We announced a Proposed Outline Development Plan for Tseung Kwan O Area 137 and the land to be created off Tseung Kwan O Area 132 in January 2023 and would listen to the views of the public.

(B) Works under Construction¹

The project will provide infrastructure for supporting the recreational development at Tseung Kwan O Stage I landfill site. The works mainly include the construction of a sewage pumping station and related sewerage facilities, and a footbridge spanning over the Eastern Channel. The works commenced in January 2021, and the prefabricated steel bridge was delivered to a temporary storage area in Junk Bay in June 2022. Foundation works for the footbridge and the sewage pumping station were in progress, and the construction works of the whole project are scheduled for completion in 2024.

2. 808CL Site Formation and Infrastructure Works for Public Housing Developments at Tseung Kwan O

The project will provide land for residential housing development, involving site formation and infrastructure works for the public housing development site at Northwest of Ying Yip Road, West of Yau Yue Wan Village and East of Hong Kong Movie City. The works commenced in end September 2021 and are scheduled for completion in 2026.

10.3 Road Improvement Works

To upgrade, improve and expand the existing road network to cope with demand

Traffic flows in the district will continue to be monitored. Necessary improvement (both major and minor) will be planned and implemented to cater for possible traffic growth. During the year 2023-24, it is expected that the following major improvement works will be continued / completed:
