Welcome Remarks

The Chairman said a quorum was present and the first meeting of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (CICRC) in 2025 commenced officially. He welcomed all Members and departmental representatives to the meeting, in particular those who attended the CICRC meeting for the first time:

- Mr WONG Hing-yan, Senior Land Executive/Land Management 1, District Lands Office, Sai Kung (DLO/SK), Lands Department (LandsD);
- Ms Jollyida HUI, School Development Officer (Sai Kung)12, Sai Kung District School Development Section, Education Bureau;
- Miss LAM Wing-sum, Assistant Social Work Officer, Wong Tai Sin/Sai Kung District Planning and Co-ordinating Team, Social Welfare Department (SWD); and
- Mr CHAN Kam-kong, Centre-In-Charge, and Miss YU Ting-ting, Social Worker, of Sheung Tak Integrated Youth Service Centre (the Service Centre), The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong (ELCHK).

I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 6th CICRC Meeting in 2024 held on 19 November 2024

2. The Chairman said the Secretariat had not received any proposed amendment before the meeting. As there was no proposed amendment in the meeting either, the Chairman declared that the above minutes were confirmed.

II. Report Items

(A) Introduction of Social Welfare Services/District Collaboration Projects in Sai Kung/Tseung Kwan O – The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong

3. Mr CHAN Kam-kong and Miss YU Ting-ting of the Service Centre, ELCHK introduced the project with the presentation slides.

4. Members' views and enquiries were summarised as follows:

- They enquired about the details of the appropriate support provided by the Service Centre to cater for the diverse needs of ethnic minorities (EMs).
- They enquired whether the Service Centre would provide vocational training or job matching services for EM youth to help them find their ideal jobs.
- They suggested that the Service Centre should strengthen support for EMs in Sai Kung town centre and Hang Hau rural areas.
- They suggested that the Service Centre should provide halal food purchasing service for EMs.

5. Mr CHAN Kam-kong, Centre-In-Charge, and Miss YU Ting-ting, Social Worker, of the Service Centre, ELCHK gave consolidated responses as follows:

- The survey conducted by the Service Centre revealed that EMs in the district were mainly of Pakistani and Indian origin. The Service Centre would organise various inclusion activities for EMs to interact with local families and deepen their mutual understanding of each other's culture. Meanwhile, the Service Centre would help EMs learn about the support services available at the Service Centre, such as assistance in applying for passports and support for pursuing studies.
- The Service Centre would also organise sharing sessions of working youth, in which EM teachers currently serving at the Hong Kong Taoist Association The Yuen Yuen Institute No. 3 Secondary School would be invited to share their own experiences. The sessions aimed to help EM children and youth understand the situation of the sector, and to offer them homework guidance.
- They noted Members' suggestions to strengthen support for EMs in different areas and provide halal food purchasing service.

9. The Chairman said the motion was moved by Mr WONG Yuen-hong and seconded by Mr CHENG Yu-hei, Mr WONG Wang-to, Mr Philip LI, Ms WU Suet-lin, Mr WAN Kai-ming, Mr LAM Chun-ka, Ms Christine FONG and Ms SZE Pan-pan.

10. Members noted the written replies from the Cultural and Creative Industries Development Agency and SWD (SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 6/25 and Paper No. 7/25).
11. Members enquired about the ancillary facilities and assistance that might be required for the provision of audio description services in the cinemas in Sai Kung District.
12. There being no objection from Members, the Chairman declared that the above motion was passed. He then asked the Secretariat to relay Members' views to The Hong Kong Society for the Blind in writing.
13. The Chairman suggested deleting the above item at the next meeting.
- (2) Suggest setting up short-term stalls and mobile service points at the Sai Kung Waterfront Promenade
(SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 5/25)
14. The Chairman said the motion was moved by Ms Christine FONG and seconded by Mr Philip LI, Mr LAM Chun-ka, Mr WAN Kai-ming, Mr CHENG Yu-hei, Ms WU Suet-lin, Mr WONG Wang-to, Mr Chris CHEUNG, Mr CHAU Ka-lok, Mr WONG Yuen-hong and Ms SZE Pan-pan.
15. Members noted the written replies from DLO/SK, the Highways Department and the Tourism Commission (SKDC(CICRC) Paper Nos. 8/25 to 10/25).
16. Members' views were summarised as follows:
- They enquired about the current form of tenancy of the market at the Sai Kung Waterfront Promenade and the utilisation of the pro-shops at the Sai Kung Waterfront Park. They suggested inviting shops in the vicinity to take up tenancy.
 - They suggested strengthening the management of mobile stalls near the piers at the waterfront promenade and setting up service points there. They also suggested that the stalls at the waterfront promenade could be rented to public organisations and non-profit-making organisations on short-term tenancies at a rental price of about \$2,000 to \$3,000, in order to promote tourism and boost the economy of Sai Kung District.
 - They suggested giving consideration to improving the existing ancillary tourism facilities, such as enhancing the images of shops and incorporating special elements in order to attract more visitors to Sai Kung.
17. Mr WONG Hing-yan, Senior Land Executive/Land Management 1, DLO/SK, LandsD responded that DLO/SK would provide supplementary information about temporary occupation of the waterfront promenade for the market after the meeting.

[Post-meeting note: DLO/SK replied to the Sai Kung District Council Secretariat in writing with the relevant information on 12 February 2025.]

18. Ms Susan LEE, District Leisure Manager (Sai Kung), Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) responded that the contracts of the pro-shops at the Sai Kung Waterfront Park were awarded through tender-bidding, and those contracts were still in force. LCSD would invite tenders before the end of the contracts. Persons interested in submitting tenders might refer to LCSD's website for updates.

19. There being no objection from Members, the Chairman declared that the above motion was passed. He then asked DLO/SK to follow up the matter.

20. The Chairman suggested deleting the above item at the next meeting.
