## **Welcome Remarks**

The Chairman said a quorum was present and the fourth meeting of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (CICRC) in 2025 commenced officially. He welcomed all Members and departmental representatives to the meeting, in particular the following representatives of the Haven of Hope Christian Service (HOHCS) who attended the CICRC meeting for the first time: Ms YU Mei-wan, Mary, Project Coordinator, Sai Kung District Health Centre Express (Sai Kung DHC Express); Mr LAM Kwan-yin, Operations Manager, Haven of Hope Bradbury King Lam Community Health Development Centre; and Ms WONG Sau-kwan, Mabel, Assistant Operations Manager, Haven of Hope Primary Health Services.

### **I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 3<sup>rd</sup> CICRC Meeting in 2025 held on 20 May 2025**

2. The Chairman said the Secretariat had not received any proposed amendment before the meeting. As there was no proposed amendment at the meeting either, the Chairman declared that the above minutes were confirmed.

### **II. Report Items**

#### **(A) Introduction of Social Welfare Services/District Collaboration Projects in Sai Kung/Tseung Kwan O – Haven of Hope Christian Service**

3. Ms YU Mei-wan, Mary, Project Coordinator, Sai Kung DHC Express; and Mr LAM Kwan-yin, Operations Manager, Haven of Hope Bradbury King Lam Community Health Development Centre; of HOHCS introduced the projects with the presentation slides.

4. Members' views and enquiries were summarised as follows:

- They suggested enhancing services in rural areas of Sai Kung, such as conducting more home visits and providing more vaccination and mobile van services, so as to support elderly persons with mobility difficulties and other individuals in need.
- They enquired about the number of participants in the Chronic Disease Co-Care Pilot Scheme (CDCC Pilot Scheme) in Sai Kung District, as well as the number of individuals diagnosed with the “three highs” (hypertension, high blood glucose and high blood lipids).
- They thanked the Sai Kung DHC Express for referring women in need to the Women Wellness Satellites (WWSs) for cervical or breast cancer screening.
- They suggested that the Sai Kung DHC Express should provide outreach services, such as promoting health information to residents in various housing estates, and organising health activities at nearby sports courts/pitches to reach more young people.

- They suggested teaching elderly citizens to use eHealth and promoting the Healthy School Program through Members to attract more student participants.
- They enquired whether the Sai Kung DHC Express would be upgraded to a District Health Centre (DHC).
- They enquired whether the Sai Kung DHC Express currently provided electronic health records to assist participants or their families in understanding their health status.

5. Ms YU Mei-wan, Mary, Project Coordinator, Sai Kung DHC Express, HOHCS gave consolidated responses as follows:

- HOHCS aimed to provide services for rural residents in Sai Kung through the Healthy Bones Program. Meanwhile, the Sai Kung DHC Express had recently organised health talks in rural Sai Kung. It also collaborated with voluntary organisations in rural areas to visit villages and provide health checks and consultation services for elderly residents in need.
- The CDCC Pilot Scheme currently had over 100,000 participants across Hong Kong. Approximately 40% of participants in the scheme were diagnosed with prediabetes, diabetes or hypertension, etc.
- Participants in the women's health services might first undergo initial assessment and consultation at the nurse clinic of the Sai Kung DHC Express. Those who need follow-up would be referred to WWSs for cervical or breast cancer screening. The Government had also launched the Breast Cancer Screening Pilot Programme, which offered screening services to high-risk women, such as those carrying certain gene mutation(s) or with a strong family history of breast cancer. DHC Expresses would refer eligible members of the public in need to designated clinics for registration and assessment appointments free of charge.
- Staff of the Sai Kung DHC Express would organise health talks and promote the CDCC Pilot Scheme to residents at various housing estates. They would also organise health promotion activities at sports courts/pitches near housing estates.
- The Sai Kung DHC Express had also collaborated with the Healthy School Program to promote physical and mental well-being among young people. She thanked Members and the Sai Kung District School Heads Association for their active promotion of the Healthy School Program.
- The Government planned to establish the Sai Kung DHC in Tseung Kwan O Area 67 in 2028. By that time, the Government would choose an operator of this service through open tendering.
- To align with the Government's policies to encourage self-management of diseases, staff of the Sai Kung DHC Express had been teaching members of the public to upload their hypertension and diabetes records to eHealth. This could assist citizens, their families and doctors in monitoring their health status.

6. Mr LAM Kwan-yin, Operations Manager, Haven of Hope Bradbury King Lam Community Health Development Centre, HOHCS said that in addition to organising health promotion activities at schools, the Healthy School Program had also held health events at various locations across the community. HOHCS would also collaborate with the Federation of Parent-Teacher Associations of the Sai Kung District to reach local parents, and to provide assistance to students in need.

(B) Update of “Tseung Kwan O Heritage Post”  
(SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 35/25)

7. Members noted the paper.

8. Regarding the Mau Wu Shan Bunker (the Bunker) near the Tseung Kwan O Heritage Post (the Heritage Post), a Member suggested that HOHCS, the operator of the Heritage Post, should undertake the management of the Bunker to organise visitor activities such as guided tours of the Bunker. The Member also suggested carrying out repairs to the Bunker and considering opening it to the public.

9. Miss LAM I-ching, Assistant District Officer (Sai Kung)1, Sai Kung District Office (SKDO) gave consolidated responses as follows:

- The Heritage Post was a project funded by a one-off government grant under the Signature Project Scheme. In the project, the former Tiu Keng Leng Police Station was refurbished as the Heritage Post. Upon completion of refurbishment, the relevant organisation operated the Heritage Post on a self-financing basis.
- She understood that some visitors to the Heritage Post were interested in visiting the Bunker. Regarding the suggestion to organise guided tours of the Bunker, SKDO had relayed Members’ views to HOHCS after the previous meeting. HOHCS stated in its post-meeting reply that it would take the suggestion into consideration when planning for future activities. Additionally, interested Members could consider organising relevant guided tours through their ward offices to promote the Bunker.
- Regarding the maintenance and safety issues of the Bunker, the relevant departments had submitted post-meeting replies after the previous meeting. SKDO would relay Members’ views once again to the District Lands Office, Sai Kung, as well as the Antiquities and Monuments Office.

10. A member suggested that future reports should include the actual number of participants in activities.

11. Miss LAM I-ching, Assistant District Officer (Sai Kung)1, SKDO said that the relevant information was provided on page 10 of the document.

(C) Report on the Half-yearly Implementation Progress of Community Involvement Programme by the Sai Kung District Office (October 2024 to March 2025)  
(SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 36/25)

12. Members noted the paper.

(D) Report on the Cultural Programmes in Sai Kung District during May to August 2025 by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department

(E) Report on the Extension Activities of the Public Libraries in Sai Kung District by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department  
(SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 38/25)

14. Members noted the paper.

15. Members' views and enquiries were summarised as follows:

- They suggested establishing regular service hours for the “Library-on-Wheels” at LOHAS Park.
- They enquired about the progress of setting up a mobile library van service point at LOHAS Park (near Men Wah Bing Teng).

16. Miss Olivia LAI, Senior Librarian (Sai Kung), Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) gave consolidated responses as follows:

- Under the “Library-on-Wheels” project, specially designed small trucks would travel to different districts of Hong Kong to provide library services and promote a citywide reading culture. The schedule of the “Library-on-Wheels” was determined by multiple factors, such as venue availability at housing estates, and the status of service points in other districts. LCSD noted Members' suggestion to establish regular service hours for the “Library-on-Wheels”, and would relay their views to the responsible colleagues for follow-up.
- As the establishment of a new mobile library van service point required a power supply, LCSD had previously liaised with the Social Welfare Department (SWD) regarding the provision of outlet electricity. However, no organisation was currently operating at that location. LCSD would continue to follow up with SWD.

### **III. Discussion Items Suggested by Members**

#### **(A) Suggest providing fitness bikes at Po Hong Park** (SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 39/25)

17. The Chairman said the discussion item was raised by Ms Christine FONG, Mr WANG Wen, Ms Wu Suet-lin, Mr Philip LI and Mr WONG Yuen-hong.

18. Members noted the written reply from LCSD (SKDC(CICRC) Paper No. 40/25).

19. Members said providing fitness bike facilities at Po Hong Park would help elderly residents maintain their health.

20. Ms Jenny LAI, Deputy District Leisure Manager (District Support) Sai Kung, LCSD said that LCSD was currently liaising with relevant works departments to explore the feasibility of providing additional fitness bike facilities. Subject to available resources and suitable venues, LCSD would formulate appropriate plans for relevant improvement works to introduce additional high-quality fitness facilities for the elderly.

21. The Chairman suggested that matters concerning the addition of community facilities could be discussed at future meetings of the District Facilities and Works Committee.

22. The Chairman suggested deleting the above discussion item at the next meeting.

### **IV. Any Other Business**

23. The Chairman congratulated Co-opted Member Ms LEUNG Fung-yu for being awarded the Medal of Honour by the Chief Executive on 1 July 2025.

24. No other business was raised by Members.

### **V. Date of Next Meeting**
