Welcome Remarks

The Chairman said a quorum was present and the third meeting of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (CICRC) in 2026 commenced officially. He welcomed all Members and departmental representatives to the meeting, in particular those who attended the CICRC meeting for the first time:

- Mr Perick WONG, Service Director; Ms Bobo WONG, Service

Supervisor; and Ms Mavis WONG, Social Worker; from the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui (HKSKH) Tseung Kwan O Aged Care Complex.

I. Confirmation of Minutes of the 2nd CICRC Meeting in 2026 held on 17 March 2026

2. The Chairman said the Secretariat had not received any proposed amendment before the meeting. As there was no proposed amendment at the meeting either, the Chairman declared that the above minutes were confirmed.

II. Report Items

(A) Introduction of Social Welfare Services/District Collaboration Projects in Sai Kung/Tseung Kwan O – “Grand Move®” Project by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Tseung Kwan O Aged Care Complex

3. Mr Perick WONG, Service Director; and Ms Bobo WONG, Service Supervisor; both from the HKSKH Tseung Kwan O Aged Care Complex introduced the project with the presentation slides.

4. Ms KI Lai-mei declared her position as the Vice-Chairperson of the Sai Kung and Tseung Kwan O Women’s Association.

5. Members’ views and enquiries were summarised as follows:

- They enquired whether outreach services could be provided in the rural areas of Hang Hau, for example, by setting up exercise groups at the Hang Hau Rural Committee or Village Offices. Members of the Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) could assist in liaising with elderly residents, while instructors could be invited to conduct classes at rural venues. Elderly participants could also receive volunteer training to serve the community.
- They pointed out that elderly residents in rural areas were reluctant to leave home due to declining physical fitness and fear of falling. They hoped that the “Grand Move®” Project (the Project) could help elderly residents reintegrate into the community and have better physical health.
- They agreed on the importance of the Project in preventing falls among the elderly, and enquired about the arrangements for day care services. For example, whether outreach or transfer services would be provided for elderly residents living in the Anderson area, or whether they would have to travel to the Tseung Kwan O complex for day care services.
- They suggested training staff of district organisations and Care Team members to serve as physical exercise instructors to guide elderly participants in engaging in a moderate amount of physical activities. This could help prevent and delay the progression of sarcopenia.
- They enquired whether the Project would consider covering the younger

elderly group aged between 60 and 64, who could be trained as volunteers or coaches for the Project.

- They asked whether the fee charged by the HKSKH John Yuen Home for the Elderly (Loving Joy Court) covered all costs and other miscellaneous charges.

6. Mr Perick WONG, Service Director, HKSKH Tseung Kwan O Aged Care Complex gave consolidated responses as follows:

- The organisation welcomed Members' suggestion to provide outreach services at rural venues to encourage elderly persons with impaired mobility to participate in relevant activities. Meanwhile, assistance from SKDC members would be needed to liaise with elderly residents and identify suitable venues. As the Project involved a fixed number of sessions and duration as required by the University of Hong Kong (HKU), he suggested discussing the collaboration arrangements in detail after the meeting.
- A new neighbourhood elderly centre was expected to commence services in the Anderson area in January 2027, whereas the existing day care services mainly covered the Tseung Kwan O area. The organisation could assist in assessing the service needs of elderly persons in the Anderson area, and provide referral services accordingly. If elderly persons required long-term day care services, the organisation would consider whether services could be provided taking into account their places of residence.
- Upon commissioning, the neighbourhood elderly centre in the Anderson area could provide primary healthcare services, which might meet some of the service needs in the area. Members were also welcome to refer suitable cases. For cases outside the service scope, the organisation would assist in referring them to appropriate services.
- HKU offered training courses for "O Coaches". Trainees could attend classes at HKU and obtain certification, after which they could assist in training elderly participants.
- Regarding collaboration with district volunteers or SKDC members' ward offices, if potential participants did not meet the age requirement for the Project, the organisation would be pleased to collaborate and provide training in its own capacity.
- Persons aged 60 or above could participate in the Grandmove 3.0 training exercises. If the mode of collaboration did not meet the funding requirements in terms of number of participants or duration, the organisation could still flexibly explore district collaboration proposals in its own capacity.
- Loving Joy Court was a self-financing residential care home. The fee covered three main meals (i.e. breakfast, lunch and dinner), afternoon tea and late-night meals, 24-hour care, the use of all facilities, laundry services and basic medical escort services for follow-up consultations, etc.

Personal consumables such as diapers should be purchased by the residents themselves. The overall charges were comparable to market rates. Apart from personal consumables, the quoted price covered all costs incurred.

- Interested Members were welcome to visit Loving Joy Court. The residential care home would undergo major renovation and improvement works in the future. Members would be notified of the relevant schedule in due course.
