

**Progress Report of Sai Kung District Council
District Facilities and Works Committee**

The fifth meeting (2024) of the Sai Kung District Council District Facilities and Works Committee (DFWC) was held on 10 September. The major issues discussed at the meeting were summarised as follows:

Urge for enhancement of the ancillary livelihood facilities in the Wan Po area/LOHAS Park

DFWC passed the above motion and noted the written replies from the Environment and Ecology Bureau (EEB), the Jockey Club HKFA Football Training Centre (FTC), the Transport Department (TD), the Health Bureau (HHB) and the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD), and requested EEB, HHB, FTC, LCSD and TD to follow up Members’ views.

Request for improvement of the barrier-free and smart facilities in public housing estates in the district

Request the Housing Department and the Link REIT to tackle the management problems of public housing estates and shopping centres/car parks respectively
