Progress Report of Sai Kung District Management Committee

The Sai Kung District Management Committee (SKDMC) held a meeting on 18 January 2026. The major issues discussed at the meeting were summarised as follows:

Unlicensed cooked food hawkers at the multi-purpose podium (near TKO Spot) managed by Link REIT

2. SKDMC discussed the situation of unlicensed food hawking at the multi-purpose podium (the podium) outside TKO Spot managed by Link Real Estate Investment Trust (Link REIT), as well as the nuisance and environmental hygiene issues caused.

3. The representatives from Link REIT attended the meeting and shared the initial idea of converting the podium into a children's play area. At present, Link REIT conducted regular joint operations with the Housing Department (HD) and the property management company of Sheung Tak Estate to combat unlicensed food hawking. During these operations, HD would take enforcement actions within Sheung Tak Estate, while the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department would patrol the public area nearby. As the relevant location was managed by Link REIT, SKDMC reiterated that Link REIT should adopt effective long-term measures to address the issue. SKDMC would continue to monitor the relevant situation.

Roles performed by various departments in emergency co-ordination

4. SKDMC reviewed the experience in coping with rainstorms in 2025, and learnt more about the work of various departments during emergency incidents. In light of the situation at Tseung Kwan O Waterfront Promenade, the Civil Engineering and Development Department reported on the latest protective measures, construction progress of the wave walls and the relevant work. When shelters under the Sai Kung District Office (SKDO) were open, the Social Welfare Department would enhance co-ordination and arrange emergency supplies based on the actual circumstances. SKDMC also discussed the arrangement of sandbags in the event of extreme weather conditions, and learnt about the stockpiles, locations for distribution and mechanisms, as well as information dissemination arrangements of the relevant departments. SKDMC would continue to co-ordinate various departmental efforts, so as to enhance work efficiency in response to extreme weather.

Illegal parking of bicycles in Sai Kung District

5. SKDMC discussed the problem of illegal parking of bicycles in Sai Kung District. The representatives from the Transport Department reported that they had discussed with two bicycle-sharing operators to set up new no-parking zones after receiving the list of black spots for illegal parking in the last meeting, which was provided by various departments and

consolidated by SKDO. SKDMC would continue to monitor the situation and follow up on the illegal parking of bicycles. SKDMC also reminded various departments to continue to monitor the relevant situation and take appropriate follow-up actions.
