**Hong Kong Police Force (Tseung Kwan O District)  
Annual District Plan 2026-27**

**Purpose**

This paper aims to set out the Annual Formation Action Plan 2026-27 of the Hong Kong Police Force (Tseung Kwan O District).

**Fight Crime**

2. Adopt a three-pronged approach of Enforcement, Education and Publicity, with multi-agency collaboration to enhance the prevention and detection of technology crime and deception.
3. Collaborate with property management companies and other stakeholders to prevent and swiftly investigate cases involving illegal debt collection activities and burglaries.
4. Strengthen the intelligence network and mount proactive operations to deter quick cash and youth crime.
5. Collaborate with community stakeholders to organize educational and interactive activities to enhance crime prevention awareness and a sense of law-abidingness among the public and young people in particular.

**Public Safety**

6. Enhance the District's capability and preparedness to ensure that significant international events are held in a safe and orderly manner.
7. Promote the safety of countryside visitors and road users, in particular elderly pedestrians, by adopting a multi-agency approach to reduce fatal and serious traffic accidents.
8. Enhance the District's capacity to deal with incidents in country areas by making full use of the Rural Patrol Cadre and strengthening our officers' capability to safeguard life and property during extreme weather events.
9. Leverage advanced technologies to support patrols, extend police coverage, boost law enforcement effectiveness, and uphold public safety.

## **National Security**

10. Collect intelligence concerning national security and refer it to the National Security Department for action.

11. Enhance the capability and sensitivity of our officers when handling national security incidents.

12. Co-operate with stakeholders in safeguarding national security and handling national security incidents in a swift and decisive manner.

13. Enhance cooperation with schools and other stakeholders to foster positive values and a sense of national identity, so as to enhance overall law-abiding awareness.

**Hong Kong Police Force (Wong Tai Sin District)  
Sai Kung Division Operational Priorities 2026-27**

**Purpose**

This paper aims to set out the Operational Priorities 2026-27 of the Hong Kong Police Force - Sai Kung Division (SKDIV).

**Work Targets**

2. The operational priorities set out the key operational areas which SKDIV will accord priority to during the year. They are a continuation of the priorities identified last year with refinements to reflect our current operating environment and key challenges in the year ahead.

**(I) National Security**

3. SKDIV will take initial actions to respond to national security related reports, as well as collect intelligence and information concerning national security and refer it to the National Security Department for actions. SKDIV will also enlist the public's trust and support for the roles and responsibilities of the Police in safeguarding national security.

**(II) Violent Crime**

4. SKDIV will ensure effective police presence to deter violent crime, particularly at high risk locations. Intelligence-led operations will be strengthened against street gangs and illegal debt collection activities, particularly those involving students and youths.

### **(III) Triads, Syndicated And Organised Crime**

#### Triads

5. SKDIV will target triad personalities and activities, in particular those exploiting students and youths, by mounting intelligence-led operations.

#### Syndicated and Organised Crime

6. Personalities and activities associated with syndicated or organised crime will be targeted, particularly those related to illegal debt collection, robbery, burglary, smuggling and unlawful gambling establishment/ unlicensed upstairs bars.

#### Crime Proceeds and Money Laundering

7. A proactive approach will be taken to investigate money laundering and to confiscate proceeds of crime.

### **(IV) Dangerous Drugs**

8. SKDIV will strengthen intelligence-led operations against drug traffickers, especially those exploiting students and youths. A multi-agency and community-based approach will also be taken to promote awareness and prevent the abuse of drugs by students and youths.

### **(V) Deception and Quick Cash Crime**

9. SKDIV will continue to raise awareness and garner support to prevent deception and quick cash crime, particularly telephone, Internet and social media deception. Criminal groups involved in deception will be targeted through joint efforts with stakeholders, supported by the Anti-Deception Coordination Centre. Strategic deployment of resources to blackspots of quick cash crime will also be ensured and SKDIV will take proactive measures including intervention with potential victims and cyber patrol against emerging trends of deception.

### **(VI) Cyber Security and Technology Crime**

10. A multi-agency approach will be taken to enhance the awareness of cyber security and the risk associated with the internet and social media. Cooperation with other law enforcement agencies and stakeholders will also be enhanced to target technology crime. Proactive measures will also be taken to investigate and gather intelligence against technology crime.

## **(VII) Public Safety**

### Public Events

11. SKDIV will continue to engage organisers, the media and other stakeholders to enhance support and mutual understanding of respective roles and responsibilities. SKDIV will also ensure that public events, large-scale sports, entertainment and celebration events are held in a safe and orderly manner, through proactive engagement and coordination with relevant stakeholders, including police headquarters' units, event organisers, venue operators and different government bureaux/departments for effective planning and execution.

12. Intelligence-led operations against groups and or individuals causing or threatening violence during public events will be strengthened, and resolute action will be taken to interdict such activities.

13. SKDIV will enhance preparedness, readiness and capability in dealing with any potential public disorder.

### Road Safety

14. SKDIV aims to reduce fatal and serious traffic accident, especially those involving the elderly, public transport, cycling and goods vehicles, through a multi-agency approach. SKDIV will also deter drink driving, drug driving, speeding, driving while disqualified and illegal road racing.

15. SKDIV will continue to promote safe cycling and pedestrian safety, with particular emphasis on the elderly. SKDIV will also ensure smooth traffic flow, particularly in areas that often encounter gridlock, through the effective application of STEP, community engagement and technology.

### Major Incidents & Extreme Weather

16. SKDIV will conduct regular multi-agency training and exercises to ensure a high level of preparedness, responsiveness and recovery capabilities in the event of major incidents and extreme weather.

## **(VIII) Terrorism**

### Prevention

17. SKDIV will strengthen the protection of critical infrastructure and sensitive premises through a multi-agency approach, as well as enhancing the awareness of both the public and frontline officers of terrorism, including domestic terrorism and self-radicalization.

### Preparedness, Response and Recovery

18. Regular training and multi-agency exercises will be conducted to test and improve contingency plans. SKDIV will also enhance the preparedness of both the public and officers to provide a rapid response to and recovery from terrorist incidents.

## **(IX) Policing of the Significant International Events**

19. SKDIV will ensure the 2026 Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Finance Ministers' Meeting and the 94th INTERPOL General Assembly are held in a safe, orderly and secure manner.

## **Conclusion**

20. Officers of SKDIV will continue serving Hong Kong with honour, duty and loyalty. Successful implementation of the priorities will strengthen our abilities to sustain efforts for maintaining a safe and stable Hong Kong.

**Hong Kong Police Force (Sau Mau Ping District)  
Annual District Plan 2026-27**

**Management Directions**

**Flexibility and Responsiveness**

- In view of the increasingly complex social environment and large-scale events, Sau Mau Ping District (SMPDIST) will conduct prior analysis of the associated risks, the number of participants, and the characteristics of events, such as processions, meetings, festive celebrations or emergency incidents. Frontline personnel will be deployed flexibly in close co-ordination with the Regional Command and Control Centre. Through flexible mobilisation and redeployment of the Quick Reaction Force, SMPDIST makes effective use of resources, while also maintaining daily patrols and ensuring that emergency services will not be affected.

**Cost-effectiveness**

- SMPDIST has proactively established regular communication mechanisms with government bureaux and departments such as the Security Bureau; the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau; the Transport Department (TD); and the Fire Services Department, through which regular inter-departmental meetings are held to share intelligence and resources. SMPDIST also adopts a public-private partnership approach, for example, by collaborating with management companies and property security companies to promote “Project Rampart” and “Project RUBYARROW”, with a view to achieving cost-effective and high-coverage crime prevention.

**Smart Policing**

- The Police have made full use of the “SmartView” programme, which combines closed-circuit television (CCTV) analytics with the number plate recognition system to quickly identify suspicious characters or vehicles. Additionally, SMPDIST has introduced the use of drones to assist in high-altitude searches and the monitoring of large-scale events, which significantly reduced the manpower required and enhanced law enforcement efficiency, resulting in the successful detection of over 900 cases.

## **Integrity Management**

- Integrity is the cornerstone of police work. The Police regularly organise sharing sessions and workshops, as well as implementing the Integrity Ambassador Programme to encourage colleagues to learn from relevant integrity management examples and remind them not to defy the law. SMPDIST has also enhanced drug testing and vetting mechanisms for financial declaration, so as to ensure that every officer upholds a high standard of integrity and professionalism in law enforcement, thereby maintaining the reputation of the Police and earning public trust.

## **Outlook for the Coming Year**

### **Community Policing**

- **People-oriented Approach**

SMPDIST will collaborate with primary and secondary schools in the district as well as the Junior Police Call (JPC) to organise various activities, including “Decoding Crime Investigations”, teen coding courses, anti-drug fencing training courses, “Peak Runner” trail running courses, pickleball courses, and visits to the Whampoa Military Academy, etc. In addition, SMPDIST will arrange drama performances on crime prevention and winter precaution anti-crime publicity activities for the Senior Police Call. Activities targeted at different ethnic groups and age groups will also be organised, with the aim of building a safe community that fosters inter-generational harmony with concerted efforts.

- **National Security Education (NSE)**

SMPDIST aims to raise public awareness of national security and enlist public trust and support for the roles and responsibilities of the Police in safeguarding national security. SMPDIST will continue to integrate NSE into daily community activities, such as by launching “Project Marching-on” and holding the “Law and Nature: 2-day, 1-night National Security Education Camp” for JPC, and collaborating with schools to set up NSE display boards, etc. SMPDIST emphasises that the Police are key enforcers in safeguarding national security. Through positive explanations, case sharing, and quiz competitions, etc., SMPDIST is committed to enhancing the public’s understanding of national security and their sense of belonging to our country, thereby building long-term public trust.

- **Mutual Trust Between the Police and the Community**

SMPDIST will further enhance efforts in organising activities of the District Fight Crime Committee by establishing a community anti-crime network. The Divisional Commander will directly answer concerns raised by committee members, and adjust patrol routes based on the intelligence gathered. Through transparent and two-way communication, SMPDIST aims to build a strong partnership with the community, working hand in hand to protect our neighbourhood and effectively combat crimes.

### **Anti-Scam 360**

- **Education and Publicity**

SMPDIST will organise anti-scam talks in schools and the community to raise public awareness. The themes of talks include real-life scenarios involving “Pretend Officials”, phishing websites, quick cash, investment scams, etc., with particular emphasis on telephone, Internet, and social media deception. These efforts aim to teach the public how to recognise scammers’ tactics and raise their vigilance against deception.

- **Multilateral Collaboration**

The Police have established prompt notification mechanisms with various stakeholders, including the banking sector, telecommunications companies, money service operators, and virtual asset platforms. Upon identification of suspicious accounts or transactions, relevant parties will collaborate to combat criminal groups involved in deception and trace the flow of funds. SMPDIST also maintains regular intelligence exchanges with law enforcement agencies in the Chinese Mainland and overseas countries to combat cross-border fraud syndicates and enhance the detection rate of relevant cases.

- **Prompt and Decisive Actions**

The Police have set up designated investigation teams targeting deception cases to proactively analyse the origins of fraudulent calls and websites. Upon identification of criminal groups, the Police will make arrests, lay charges, and apply for enhanced sentences, etc. SMPDIST will also release the results of law enforcement efforts to the public in a timely manner, and leverage media coverage to produce a deterrent effect, so that potential fraudsters would understand that committing fraud in Hong Kong comes with dire consequences.

### **Kai Tak Sports Park (KTSP)**

- **Smart Policing**

KTSP is Hong Kong’s largest multi-purpose sports and entertainment landmark.

The Police have launched the “Easy Leave” platform, which integrates CCTV and crowd flow analytics both inside and outside KTSP with the aid of artificial intelligence image analysis to identify unusual behaviours and overcrowding risks in real time. Based on the scale and risks of events, SMPDIST will flexibly deploy manpower and utilise drones for high-altitude monitoring to ensure safety and prevent over-mobilisation, with a view to leveraging technology to optimise manpower while maintaining robust law enforcement efforts. Meanwhile, the Police are collaborating with The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology to study the extension of the Smart Traffic Management System to KTSP, so as to facilitate enhanced traffic arrangements during major events.

- **Collaboration and Co-creation**

Through active communication and collaboration with relevant stakeholders, including Police Headquarters Units, event organisers, venue managers and various government departments, SMPDIST will hold regular joint meetings to review event safety plans, evacuation routes and venue equipment, etc. SMPDIST will effectively plan and execute relevant tasks, ensuring that all stakeholders are familiar with the emergency response procedures so that events are held in a safe and orderly environment.

- **Bringing Benefits and Convenience to the Public**

The Police understand that spectators prefer entering and leaving the venue smoothly, whereas nearby residents are concerned about the traffic impact. In this regard, crowd management measures will be arranged with a people-oriented approach, including the provision of clear signage and dedicated access routes for wheelchair users. SMPDIST will work with TD to co-ordinate traffic arrangements for MTR services, taxi services, and special bus routes. Resident access routes will also be provided. The Police will collect feedback from both residents and spectators to enhance relevant measures on an ongoing basis, thereby ensuring that such arrangements are genuinely convenient for the public with minimal disturbance.
