## Report on the meeting of the Traffic and Transport Committee held on 5 September 2014

- (1) The Committee discussed the following:
  - (i) reply of the Transport Department to the question on "Cross-boundary Coach Services in Sha Tin", and passed the following provisional motion unanimously:
    - "In view of traffic congestion and the hygiene problem caused by traffic chaos and poor management at several boarding/alighting points of cross-boundary coaches in Sha Tin, it is suggested that the Transport Department should look for suitable locations in Sha Tin town centre, such as Wai Wah Centre and Tai Wai Transport Interchange, for setting up permanent well-managed boarding/alighting points of cross-boundary coaches, so as to resolve the current issues of traffic congestion and overcrowding as well as improve environmental hygiene, thereby avoiding nuisances caused to the daily lives of the residents of Sha Tin town centre."; and
  - (ii) replies of the Transport Department, the Kowloon Motor Bus Company (1933) Limited and the Housing Department to the question on "Bus Services in Sha Tin".
- (2) The Committee endorsed the following:
  - revised member lists of the Committee's Working Group on Development of Cycle Network and the Working Group on Development of Major Transport Infrastructures in Sha Tin District; and
  - (ii) meeting schedule of the Committee for 2015.
- (3) The Committee noted the following:
