Report on the meeting of the  
Development, Housing, Environment and Health Committee held on 18 January 2022

- (1) The nomination for election of the Chairman of the Committee and the result were as follows:

- (i) the following candidate was nominated for the post of Chairman of the Committee:

Mr CHOW Hiu-laam, Felix	Mr CHENG Chung-hang	Mr HUI Lap-san Mr SIN Cheuk-nam

- (ii) as there was only one candidate, Mr CHOW Hiu-laam, Felix was elected ipso facto as Chairman of the Committee.

- (2) The nomination for election of the Vice-Chairman of the Committee and the result were as follows:

as the Secretariat did not receive any nomination form by the end of the nomination period, the post of Vice-Chairman of the Committee was vacant.

- (3) The Committee discussed the following:

- (i) the Redevelopment of Prince of Wales Hospital, Phase 2 (Stage 1) – Main Works;
- (ii) the Relocation of Sha Tin Sewage Treatment Works to Caverns – Progress Report;
- (iii) the reply of the Environment Bureau to the question on “Promotion of Renewable Energy in Sha Tin”; and
- (iv) the replies of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, the Housing Department and the Environmental Protection Department to the question on “Implementation of GREEN@COMMUNITY in Sha Tin”, and passed the following provisional motion:

“ As the Municipal Solid Waste Charging Scheme will be implemented soon, the Government has to allocate additional resources to strengthen support for waste reduction and recycling, with a view to further reducing the quantity of the municipal solid waste. In view of this, the Development, Housing, Environment and Health Committee of the Sha Tin District Council moves that:

- 1. the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and relevant government

departments are requested to allocate additional resources to set up more Recycling Stores of GREEN@COMMUNITY in Sha Tin District and to strengthen monitoring of services provided by the contractors;

2. the EPD and relevant government departments are requested to establish ties with property management companies, residents' groups and district-based organisations for setting up additional mobile recycling spots in the public area of private housing estates in Sha Tin District, with a view to further increasing the quantity of the recyclables recovered;

3. the relevant government departments are requested to provide additional resources for promoting the development of environmental industries and the local recycling business as an industry.”

- (ii) Sha Tin District Anti-rodent Campaign 2022 (First Phase);
- (iii) Sha Tin District Anti-mosquito Campaign 2022 (First Phase); and
