The Meeting

I Opening Remarks and Introduction

The Chairman welcomed Members and representatives from government departments to the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Community Involvement, Culture and Recreation Committee (CICRC).

2. The Chairman stated that according to the requirements stipulated in the Tsuen Wan District Council Standing Orders, if a District Council (DC) Member found that he/she had any direct personal or pecuniary interests in a discussion item or relevant matters when attending a meeting of the Council or dealing with matters related to the Council, the DC Member should declare the interests. The Secretariat had not received any declaration of interests prior to this meeting. The Chairman enquired whether Members had to make declarations of interests immediately. No Member made a declaration of interests immediately.

3. The Chairman said that Members could speak once and make supplementary remarks once on each agenda item at the meeting. Each Member could speak up to two minutes in the first round of speeches and up to one minute in the second round of speeches.

II Item 1: Confirmation of Minutes of the 10<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 21.8.2025

4. The Chairman said that the Secretariat had not received any proposed amendment prior to this meeting. The Chairman enquired whether Members had to put forth proposed amendments immediately. No Member put forth a proposed amendment immediately. Members unanimously endorsed the captioned minutes.

III Item 2: Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meetings

5. The Chairman said that there were no matters arising from the minutes of the previous meeting.

IV Item 3: Proposal for Organising Broadcasting Activities in Tsuen Wan District on Nationally Significant Festive Occasions  
(TWDC CICRC Paper No. 15/25-26)

6. The Chairman said that Mr CHAN Chun-chung, Ms CHAN Shun-shun, Mr WONG Kai-chun and Mr CHOW Sum-ming submitted the paper. The representatives from the departments responsible for giving responses were:

- (1) Mr CHEUNG Chak-ho, Alex, Assistant District Officer (Tsuen Wan) (ADO(TW)), Tsuen Wan District Office (TWDO);
- (2) Ms TSE Sai-lin, Jasmine, Deputy District Leisure Manager (Tsuen Wan) District Support (DDL(M)(TW)DS), Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD);
- (3) Mr YAU Wai-kit, Angus, Senior Librarian (Tsuen Wan) (SL(TW)), LCSD; and
- (4) Miss LEUNG Wai-nga, Viola, Senior Manager (New Territories South) Promotion (SM(NTS)P), LCSD.

7. Mr CHAN Chun-chung introduced the paper.

8. The views of Members were summarised as follows:

- (1) a Member said that the military parade hosted by the Motherland was of great significance, and suggested organising sharing sessions or talks for persons who had personally taken part in the parade to share their experiences and observations with members of the public, thereby deepening the public's understanding of national affairs;
- (2) a Member suggested organising broadcasting activities at suitable locations (such as large shopping malls) in Tsuen Wan district during nationally significant festive occasions for members of the public to participate in national events together, thereby creating an enthusiastic atmosphere for the events and heightening the sense of national identity among the public;
- (3) a Member proposed that the broadcasts could cover major international events (such as the International Federation of Football Association World Cup) and be supplemented with talks or sharing sessions so as to deepen the educational significance of the activities; and
- (4) a Member said that setting up broadcasting spots at public venues (such as shopping malls, etc.) could promote multi-level coordination among schools, families as well as the community, ultimately maximising the overall effect. The Member suggested that government departments should step up efforts in the preliminary publicity work of the activities.

9. ADO(TW) of the TWDO responded as follows:

- (1) broadcasting activities provided members of the public with the opportunities to witness significant moments of our country, which could strengthen their patriotic sentiments and enhance their knowledge of the nation's history and culture. Therefore, the TWDO supported organisations in hosting such kind of activities. The TWDO was pleased to learn that many community

groups and schools had relayed the military parade at the commemorative rally marking the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of victory in the Chinese People's War of Resistance against Japanese Aggression and the World Anti-Fascist War in the district, bringing members of the public together to celebrate the nation's strength and prosperity;

- (2) as regards the organisation of broadcasting activities, both the community halls and community centres under the TWDO could provide suitable venues and basic equipment for organisations to apply for hire; and
- (3) regarding Members' suggestion that local shopping malls should organise more broadcasting activities during specific festive occasions, the TWDO would convey the suggestion concerned to the shopping mall operators.

10. DDLM(TW)DS of the LCSD responded as follows:

- (1) the LCSD would continue its previous practice of setting up focal sites for large-scale sports events. With a view to encouraging the public to show enthusiastic support for and actively engage in the 15<sup>th</sup> National Games (the "15<sup>th</sup> NG") as well as the 12<sup>th</sup> National Games for Persons with Disabilities (the "12<sup>th</sup> NGD") and the 9<sup>th</sup> National Special Olympic Games (the "9<sup>th</sup> NSOG"), the LCSD would set up the "15<sup>th</sup> NG, 12<sup>th</sup> NGD and 9<sup>th</sup> NSOG Focal Site" at Tsuen Wan West Sports Centre for members of the public to witness and cheer for the remarkable performance of elite athletes. The LCSD welcomed DC Members to organise activities that allowed members of the public to watch the competitions of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG together; and
- (2) relevant events would be broadcast via television channel 36 of Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) throughout the 15<sup>th</sup> NG. The LCSD encouraged the public to actively engage in this national sports event through watching the competitions.

11. SL(TW) of the LCSD responded that Tsuen Wan Public Library would display books on relevant themes to enrich the public's knowledge on nationally significant festive occasions.

12. SM(NTS)P of the LCSD responded that the LCSD welcomed applications from local groups or organisations for hiring venues in Tsuen Wan Town Hall to organise broadcasting activities related to nationally significant festive occasions in accordance with the booking arrangements and conditions of use.

V Item 4: Proposal for Enhancing Publicity and Public Engagement Strategies of the National Games in Tsuen Wan District

(TWDC CICRC Paper No. 16/25-26)

13. The Chairman said that Mr LAU Chung-kong, Mr TSANG Tai, Mr NG Chun-yu, Ms CHAN Shun-shun, Mr MOK Yuen-kwan and Mr CHAN Chun-chung submitted the paper. The representatives from the departments responsible for giving responses were:

- (1) Mr CHEUNG Chak-ho, Alex, ADO(TW), TWDO;

- (2) Ms TSE Sai-lin, Jasmine, DDLM(TW)DS, LCSD;
- (3) Ms CHAN Sui-wun, Wendy, Senior School Development Officer (Tsuen Wan)1 (SSDO(TW)1), Education Bureau (EDB); and
- (4) Mr LEUNG Yu-sun, Senior Housing Manager/Wong Tai Sin, Tsing Yi & Tsuen Wan 2 (SHM/WTT2), Housing Department (HD).

Besides, the written reply of the EDB was tabled at the meeting.

- 14. Mr LAU Chung-kong introduced the paper.
- 15. The views of Members were summarised as follows:
  - (1) a Member suggested stepping up the publicity efforts on the 15<sup>th</sup> NG in Tsuen Wan district to foster a deeper understanding and a greater sense of participation regarding this national sports event among members of the public (students in particular);
  - (2) a Member proposed strengthening the dissemination of information about the 15<sup>th</sup> NG to schools by engaging with associations of heads of schools; and
  - (3) a Member proposed highlighting Hong Kong athletes participating in the 15<sup>th</sup> NG in promotional campaigns (such as setting up athlete-themed display boards, etc.) and incorporating interactive elements to enhance the public's level of involvement.
- 16. ADO(TW) of the TWDO responded as follows:
  - (1) the TWDO would coordinate the mounting of buntings in the district to promote the 15<sup>th</sup> NG;
  - (2) the table tennis (TT11) events of the 12<sup>th</sup> NGD and the 9<sup>th</sup> NSOG would be held at Tsuen Wan Sports Centre. In light of this, the TWDO had incorporated elements of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG into the promotional campaigns for local sports events. For instance, the mascots of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG, the 12<sup>th</sup> NGD and the 9<sup>th</sup> NSOG, Xiyangyang and Lerongrong, had been arranged to make an appearance at the opening ceremony of the 31<sup>st</sup> Tsuen Wan Sports Festival. Souvenirs of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG had also been distributed to members of the public at sports activities, with a view to enhancing publicity and encouraging the public to cheer for the participating athletes; and
  - (3) the TWDO would maintain close liaison with the National Games Coordination Office (Hong Kong) (NGCO) and the LCSD to step up efforts in promoting the 15<sup>th</sup> NG in the district.
- 17. DDLM(TW)DS of the LCSD responded as follows:
  - (1) the LCSD had long been readily making complementary efforts to support the NGCO. It had gradually taken forward the publicity work of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG since January 2025, which included putting up posters and hanging banners at sports venues under its purview, as well as setting up mascot standees and photo-taking spots;
  - (2) the LCSD had incorporated elements of the 15<sup>th</sup> NG into the Sport For All Day held in August 2025 and other local sports activities (such as table tennis competitions, basketball games, fencing play-in day and elderly sports fun

- day). It would also set up the “15<sup>th</sup> NG, 12<sup>th</sup> NGD and 9<sup>th</sup> NSOG Focal Site” at Tsuen Wan West Sports Centre; and
- (3) the LCSD welcomed Members and local groups to hire its venues to organise activities related to the 15<sup>th</sup> NG, and would make complementary efforts to support the NGCO in disseminating the latest information.
18. SSDO(TW)1 of the EDB responded as follows:
- (1) the EDB had long been working in tandem with the General Administration of Sport of China and the NGCO to assist schools in promoting the 15<sup>th</sup> NG;
  - (2) the EDB had provided schools with relevant resources and information on activities, and had organised student activities (such as sharing sessions by elite athletes cum sports exchange demonstrations) as well as trainings for teachers;
  - (3) since the 2024-25 school year, the EDB had organised over ten student activities and two training activities for teachers. It had also produced/disseminated about 20 sets of learning and teaching resources (including infographics, short videos and presentation slides, etc.) for use by schools; and
  - (4) the EDB had issued a total of 13 EDB circulars to schools, publicising and promoting various educational resources and student activities.
19. SHM/WTT2 of the HD responded that the HD would make an all-out effort in supporting and complementing the publicity work of the Government. It had put up notices at public rental housing estates to inform residents about the RTHK’s arrangement of relaying relevant competitions throughout the 15<sup>th</sup> NG. Should additional promotional posters be received subsequently, arrangements would be made to display them in the ground floor lobbies of domestic blocks in all estates.

22. SM(NTS)P of the LCSD introduced the paper.

23. A Member enquired about the progress of the Venue Partnership Scheme (the “Partnership Scheme”).

24. SM(NTS)P of the LCSD responded that the LCSD had forwarded the latest information of the Partnership Scheme to Members via email earlier. The application period for the new round of the Partnership Scheme had ended on 20 August 2025, and the applications concerned were currently under review. The LCSD would provide timely updates to Members regarding the latest developments.

IX Item 8: Information Paper

Half-yearly Report on the Promotional Activities of Public Libraries in Tsuen Wan District by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (From April to September 2025)

(TWDC CICRC Paper No. 20/25-26)

25. SL(TW) of the LCSD introduced the paper.

X Item 9: Any Other Business

26. In regard to the production of fai chun and red packet envelopes of the Tsuen Wan District Council (TWDC), the Chairman suggested drawing reference from the practice of the previous year to apply for grants under the Community Involvement Fund in the name of the CICRC. Members unanimously agreed to the arrangement.

27. The Chairman said that, with a view to promoting the importance and benefits of regular participation in sports and other physical activities among the public, the Community Sports Section of the LCSD had invited the TWDC to nominate no less than two DC Members to serve as the “Sports Ambassadors”, who would encourage and motivate local residents to take part in sports activities for establishing a healthy lifestyle. The term of office of “Sports Ambassadors” was two years, starting from January 2026 to the end of December 2027. He suggested nominating Mr MOK Yuen-kwan and Mr CHOW Sum-ming to continue serving as the “Sports Ambassadors”. Members unanimously supported the arrangement.

28. The Chairman said that the 59<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Brands and Products Expo (HKBPE) organised by the Chinese Manufacturers’ Association of Hong Kong would be held at Victoria Park from 13 December 2025 to 5 January 2026. The organiser had invited Tsuen Wan district to arrange a performing unit to perform during the HKBPE. With reference to the practice in the previous year, the CICRC would write to local schools and art/performing groups to invite the schools or groups that were interested in performing at the HKBPE on behalf of Tsuen Wan district. Members unanimously agreed to the arrangement.

(Post-meeting note: The Secretariat sent invitation letters to schools and art/performing groups in the district on 24 October 2025.)

29. The Chairman said that the Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC)

would organise DesignInspire 2025 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre from 4 to 6 December 2025. The event brought together global design and creative elites, trend-setting brands, associations and academies to showcase outstanding creativity through exhibitions, seminars and workshops. Given Tsuen Wan district's ongoing commitment to promote cultural, sports and travel activities as well as the development of arts and culture, the HKTDC had invited the TWDC to become a supporting organisation of the aforesaid event. The Chairman asked if Members agreed that the TWDC should become a supporting organisation of the aforesaid event and approved its use of the TWDC's logo. Members unanimously agreed to the arrangements.

XI Adjournment of Meeting

30. The Chairman reminded Members that the next meeting was scheduled for 11 December 2025 (Thursday) and the deadline for submission of papers was 26 November 2025 (Wednesday).
