**Opening Remarks**

Mr Joey LEE, the Vice-chairperson, welcomed Members and representatives of government departments to the 14th meeting of the Food & Environmental Hygiene Committee (FEHC).

2. Mr Joey LEE, the Vice-chairperson, reported that prior to the meeting, Dr TANG King-yung, Anna had notified the Secretariat of her absence due to other commitments. According to Order 51(1) of Standing Orders of the Wan Chai District Council (WCDC), WCDC would only accept Members' applications for absence on the grounds of sickness or attendance at another activity on behalf of WCDC. Therefore, Dr TANG King-yung, Anna would be regarded as absent from meeting on this occasion.

**Item 1: Confirmation of Minutes of the 13th Meeting of the FEHC of the WCDC**

3. Mr Joey LEE, the Vice-chairperson said that the Secretariat had received no proposed amendments before the meeting. As there were no proposal of amendment by Members during the meeting, the minutes of the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting were confirmed by means of a motion moved by Ms Yolanda NG and seconded by Mr Anson LAM.

**Information Items**

4. Mr Joey LEE, the Vice-chairperson asked the Secretary to introduce the paper.
5. The Secretary introduced the paper to Members.
6. Members noted the captioned paper.

## Discussion Items

### **Item 4: Action Checklist of the FEHC of the WCDC**

(FEHC Paper No. 2/2018)

8. Mr Joey LEE, the Vice-chairperson welcomed representatives of the following departments to the meeting:

9. In accordance with the results discussed at the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, all government departments concerned had delivered the latest updates in respect of all items on the action checklist.

(Mr CHENG Ki-kin and Dr Jennifer CHOW attended the meeting at 2:40 p.m.; Ms Kenny LEE attended the meeting at 2:45 p.m.)

10. Ms Peggy Lee raised follow-up questions/ comments as follows:

- i. As there was a growing number of telecommunications salesman illegally placing easy-mount frames and tripod promotional displays on 2 O'brien Road, which led to severe road obstruction, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) was requested to clean up respective articles and reinforce prosecution;
- ii. The hygiene of the snack shop on 2 O'brien Road had improved, but since there were still a number of citizens littering in the area, staff of the FEHD were requested to advise concerned citizens during patrolling, and make prosecution when necessary;
- iii. The FEHD was requested to follow up the problem caused by droppings of feral pigeons on 2 O'brien Road, and was suggested to place warning signs

in order to create a promotional and deterrent effect.

(Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, attended the meeting at 2:55 p.m.)

11. Ms Yolanda NG raised follow-up questions/ opinions as follows:

- i. The concerned departments were requested to continue the follow-up on demonstrations in the district that were held by organisations and religious groups with different stances as it caused disturbance to citizens. They were also requested to propose new solutions in order to troubleshoot the problem;
- ii. As there was a severe issue of the illegal placement of easy-mount frames near Paterson Street, the FEHD was requested to follow up on the matter;
- iii. The television report on the two snack shops on Cannon Street had attracted large number of visitors, and the resulting hygiene issues raised concerns. Furthermore, another snack shop on Cannon Street to which the FEHD had issued summon raised concern. While it had been closed down, it was then reopened to business afterwards in appalling condition and worrying hygiene, the FEHD was hence requested to follow up on the matter;
- iv. The droppings of feral pigeons on the road surface of Paterson Street remained a serious problem, the departments concerned were thus requested to follow up on the matter;
- v. The poor hygiene at the Refuse Collection Point in Causeway Bay district raised concern. It was noticed that there was a number of rubbish bags piling up near Refuse Collection Points, including on Jardine's Crescent, Cannon Street, Lockhart Road and Jaffe Road, etc., meanwhile, the noise of refuse collection vehicle had caused disturbance to nearby citizens, the FEHD was hence requested to follow up on the matter;
- vi. The environmental hygiene problem caused by illegal cooking and unlicensed hawkers at Victoria Park and its periphery remained serious, some persons openly carried out transactions without being prosecuted, all departments concerned were thus requested to follow up on the matter.

12. Dr Jennifer CHOW raised follow-up questions/ opinions as follows:

- i. While there were illegal display of mobile billboards and easy-mount frames on Tsing Fung Street, the FEHD was requested to clean them up and reinforce prosecution in the area;
- ii. The FEHD was requested to follow up the condition of itinerant hawkers at the exit of Tin Hau MTR station, and reinforce supervision on the matter;
- iii. The droppings of feral pigeons on road surfaces of the park near Ngan Mok Street and nearby buildings remained a serious problem, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) and the FEHD were requested to follow up on the matter and step up cleaning efforts;
- iv. Agreed with the opinion of Ms Yolanda NG, it was pointed out that the environmental hygiene problem brought by illegal cooking and unlicensed hawkers at Victoria Park and its periphery had not been improved, and the vending area was also gradually expanding. As a result, all concerned departments were requested to propose new solutions;
- v. The departments concerned were requested to follow up the road obstruction issue brought by a paper waste and metal recycler at King Ming Road;
- vi. In light of the refuse piling issue at the rear alley of the Wing Hing Street Refuse Collection Point, the FEHD was requested to follow up on the matter;

13. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded as follows:

- i. The FEHD was very concerned about the illegal display of easy-mount frames and other advertising signs. In the past two months, the FEHD had removed 15 illegally-displayed easy-mount frames and advertising signs on 2 O'Brien Road; the department had also made 38 prosecutions of illegally-displayed easy-mount frames and advertising signs on Great George Street and East Point Road; and 5 prosecutions against beneficiaries of the promotional advertisements and had removed 18 illegally-displayed easy-mount frames and advertising signs on Tsing Fung Street, Tin Hau. The FEHD would continue the follow-up on the road obstruction caused by illegally-displayed easy-mount frames and advertising signs;

- ii. The FEHD had already allocated substantial resources to handle the issue of feral pigeons feeding, which gave rise to dirty areas in the district. The FEHD staff had also followed up on the acute situation of some areas, including Tin Hau District, the junction of Leighton Road and Wong Nai Chung Road, and Paterson Street, etc. Regarding the suspicion that there were persons employing trucks to transport fodder to various pigeon-feeding blackspots and dropping large amount of fodder on the road, the FEHD staff had inspected for a number of times on the matter, and made three prosecutions in total against the persons concerned for dirtying public areas by feeding feral pigeons. The FEHD would install internet protocol cameras at the three above-mentioned blackspots in May 2018, in order to create a deterrent effect and facilitate prosecution;
- iii. The FEHD would fight for more resources to be allocated, and step up the cleaning of rubbish bags on the street;
- iv. The FEHD had made two prosecutions against the snack shop at Cannon Street, and would continue following up on the suspicion that there was snack shop using nearby residential flats as food processing factories;
- v. Regarding the illegal cooking and unlicensed selling at Victoria Park and its periphery, the FEHD had deployed more staff for fixed-point patrolling, and would continue conducting joint operations every two weeks in order to have optimum control on the issues; in the past two months, the FEHD had handled and moved away abandoned objects of hawkers in 65 cases;
- vi. There were regularly four licensed itinerant hawkers in Tin Hau District. In case of road obstruction caused by itinerant hawkers, the FEHD would carry out law enforcement in a “warning before prosecution” manner. In the past two months, the FEHD had made 24 warnings and 8 prosecutions against the above four hawkers. The FEHD would continue to follow up on road obstruction issues caused by itinerant hawkers;
- vii. The FEHD would follow up on the refuse piling issue at Wing Hing Street Refuse Collection Point.

14. Mr Ricky WONG of the LCSD responded as follows:

- i. The LCSD had posted notice at the recreational facilities near Ngan Mok

Street to remind citizens that persons who illegally fed feral pigeons would be subjected to prosecution. The department had also stepped up patrolling and cleaning efforts at the facilities;

- ii. Regarding the illegal cooking and unlicensed selling at Victoria Park and its periphery, 5 joint operations were conducted in the past two months, and the LCSD had prosecuted three persons for illegal hawking. Moreover, the LCSD had also taken 14 law enforcement actions at Victoria Park against illegal hawking activities in the past two months, prosecuted 1 person at Victoria Park for illegal hawking, and seized abandoned goods of 27 cases. The department would continue to conduct patrolling and law enforcement actions mainly at illegal hawking blackspots.

15. Mr WONG Lung of the Hong Kong Police Force (HKPF) pointed out that the Police Force would make use of both soft and hard tactics in the handling of the disturbance issue caused by demonstrations of organisations on Great George Street, including reinforcing communication with organisations, stepping up patrolling, and inviting citizens as deponent for the above behaviour. The Police Force is currently in consultation with the Department of Justice regarding the above matter.

16. Dr Jennifer Chow raised follow-up questions/ opinions as follows:

- i. The FEHD was requested again to follow up on the illegal display of mobile advertising lightbox on Tsing Fung Street;
- ii. The FEHD was requested to be attentive to privacy issues while installing internet protocol cameras for inspection, it was added that the camera should only record at an angle towards the park;
- iii. The FEHD was requested again to follow up the road obstruction issue caused by a paper waste and metal recycler on King Ming Road.

17. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded as follows:

- i. Concerning the illegal display of mobile advertising lightbox on Tsing Fung Street, the FEHD had already referred related cases to the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department, and had advised the persons concerned to move the advertising lightbox inside the shop;

- ii. The FEHD was very attentive to the privacy issues brought by internet protocol cameras, and emphasised that the cameras would only record at public areas.
18. Ms LEUNG Tsz-chun of the HKPF pointed out that the police had listed King Ming Road and Glass Street as traffic blackspots, and would conduct law enforcement priorities at least once a week, while continue reinforcing law enforcement and communication with tenants.
19. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, enquired of the Wan Chai District Office (WCDO) about the effectiveness of joint operations conducted against the road obstruction issue caused by “villain hitting” under Canal Road Flyover.
20. Miss Amy Wong, the assistant district officer, pointed out that under instructions of the committee, the WCDO had been coordinating all departments concerned to carry out joint operations that troubleshoot the road obstruction issue brought by “villain hitting” activities since September 2017. The WCDO conducted joint operation with the FEHD and the HKPF in the afternoon of 5<sup>th</sup> February 2018.
21. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD added that in addition to joint operations, the department had also strengthened communication with the persons in charge of the “villain hitting” stalls at the above-mentioned address, while some of the stalls showed hint of toning down and softening, the situation had improved. Moreover, the FEHD would closely monitor the situation during the solar term “Awakening of Insects”.
22. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, pointed out that there were still a number of banners hanging on the railings, affecting the judgement of drivers and safety of pedestrians. In addition, there were still a number of articles being placed under the Canal Road Flyover at night. Departments concerned were hence requested to propose solutions to the matter.
23. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded that the above matter would continue be followed up, and more communication would be carried out with the persons in charged of the “villain hitting” stalls.
24. Mr WONG Lung of the HKPF pointed out that the police would remove any banners that they found affecting safety of drivers and pedestrians; for banners that would not require urgent handling, the police would hand the cases over to

the FEHD.

25. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, raised that as the solar term “Awakening of Insects” came soon, there might be law-breakers setting up new “villain hitting” stalls under Canal Road Flyover to make money, thus all respective departments were requested to keep in view of the situation and set up action plans in advance.
26. Dr Jennifer CHOW pointed out that the problem of feral pigeon droppings on Lau Sin Street, Ngan Mok Street and canopies of nearby buildings remained serious, the FEHD was thus requested to follow up on the matter. Dr Chow raised that the FEHD should set up long-, medium- and short-term solution plans in order to solve the environmental hygiene issue caused by feral pigeon droppings, in which stepping up cleaning efforts on streets should be put in the first priority.

**Item 5: Environmental Hygiene Blackspots Action Checklist of the FEHC of the WCDC**

**(FEHC Paper No. 3/2018)**

27. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, welcomed representatives of the following departments to the meeting:

28. In accordance with the results discussed at the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, all government departments concerned had delivered the latest updates in respect of all blackspots on the action checklist.
29. Members raised follow-up questions/ opinions as follows:
  - i. Ms Peggy LEE enquired of the FEHD about the frequency of cleaning ditches outside the snack shop on 2 O’Brien Road. Moreover, Ms LEE

requested the FEHD to continue cleaning up articles like chairs that were placed outside the Methadone Clinic at the above-mentioned address. Ms LEE also requested the FEHD to step up efforts in combating littering issue at the above area;

- ii. Dr Jennifer CHOW pointed out that the rodent problem was appalling at Wing Hing Street Refuse Collection Point, the rear alley of Gordon Road and Whitfield Road, the FEHD was thus requested to step up cleaning efforts at the above areas;
- iii. Ms Kenny LEE pointed out that there were courier companies on Lun Fat Street loading and unloading on pedestrian way, which led to road obstruction, and also affected environmental hygiene, giving rise to rodent problem, the FEHD and HKPF were thus requested to step up cleaning efforts and law enforcement;
- iv. Ms Yolanda NG said that there had been articles randomly placed at the side alley of Jaffe Building, and as the problem persisted, the FEHD was requested to follow up on the matter. Ms NG also pointed out that the environmental hygiene at the entrance of Tung Lung Chau Market at Jardine's Bazaar had improved, however, as there was still a quantity of abandoned articles along with uneven road surface at the area, the FEHD and the Highways Department were requested to follow up on the matter;
- v. Miss Clarisse YEUNG showed concern about the worsening of rodent problems at alleys in Tai Hang, the departments concerned were thus requested to step up efforts in combating the problem. Moreover, Miss YEUNG pointed out that the environmental hygiene on the road surface of 1 Moreton Terrace was appalling; while a quantity of articles was abandoned in the area, it was not in line with the situation reported by departments during the meeting, the departments concerned were hence requested to follow up practically on the matter;
- vi. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, said that while construction work was going on at the T-shape rear alley between Bowrington Road and Canal Road West, a number of articles were abandoned at the area. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson understood that it was not the best time to clean up the articles there, but concerned departments were requested to carry on the follow-up on the environmental hygiene condition at the area. Moreover, Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson was concerned about

the environmental hygiene at the junction of Bowrington Road and Wan Chai Road near the Bowrington Road Market and Cooked Food Centre. While the market had a number of visitors during the Chinese New Year, there were shops randomly disposing refuse, which led to the piling of articles and refuse on the road. Furthermore, some of the shops occupied public spaces and caused road obstruction; the overall environmental hygiene had worsened and affected the daily lives of citizens. The FEHD was hence requested to follow up on the matter.

30. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded as follows:

- i. The FEHD would clean the ditches outside the snack shop on 2 O'Brien Road every two weeks, and continue following up on the littering issue of citizens. In the past two months, the FEHD had made 56 prosecutions against citizens;
- ii. The FEHD would continue to follow up the rodent problem in the district, including at the rear alley of Gordon Road, Whitfield Road and the side alley of Lun Fat Street, etc.;
- iii. The FEHD would continue to follow up the road obstruction issue caused by courier companies on Lun Fat Street;
- iv. The department would continue following up the environmental hygiene condition at the side alley of Jaffe Building, the rear alley of Jardine's Crescent, the streets near Hoi Kung Court and 1 Moreton Terrace, etc.. The FEHD had allocated more resources this year to clean the streets every one to two weeks, depending on the hygiene condition of the streets. High pressure water jets would be used to remove stubborn stains; more refuse collection vehicles would also be deployed to clear refuse on streets;
- v. Concerning the environmental hygiene at the junction of Bowrington Road and Wan Chai Road near the Bowrington Road Market and Cooked Food Centre, the FEHD would continue reinforcing law enforcement in accordance with the law enforcement standard (not affecting pedestrian flow safety and traffic road safety); meanwhile the department disagreed with the way shops placed their products on traffic roads, which would lead to road obstruction. With regard to improving urban environment, more vehicles were deployed in the morning and evening to collect refuse and avoid piling.

31. Regarding the obstruction caused by the recycler on Lun Fat Street, Mr WONG Lung of the HKPF replied that the police force would carry on with patrolling at the area and advising the concerned recycler.
32. Mr KAM Yuet Wang of the Highways Department responded that staff would be deployed to investigate the condition of the uneven road surface at the entrance of Tung Lung Chau Market on Jardine's Bazaar.
33. Dr Jennifer CHOW raised concern on the environmental hygiene issue caused by dog excreta on 1 Victoria Park Road, the FEHD was hence requested to clean the area. Dr CHOW also enquired of the department about the current frequency of cleaning hygiene blackspots.
34. Ms Yolanda NG pointed out that the issue of uneven road surface at the entrance of Tung Lung Chau Market on Jardine's Bazaar had already been raised half year ago, while the suggestion of road resurfacing work had also been proposed to the concerned construction departments through the FEHD, it was difficult to understand the fact that the Highways Department had not discovered the issue.
35. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded as follows:
- i. The FEHD cleaned streets in the Wan Chai District with street washing vehicle every one to two weeks, and would adjust cleaning frequency as the condition may require;
  - ii. The FEHD would continue following up the environmental hygiene on 1 Victoria Park Road.
36. Mr KAM Yuet Wang of the Highways Department responded that the department had deployed staff in 2018 for the investigation on the uneven road surface at the entrance of Tung Lung Chau Market on Jardine's Bazaar, and would continue to follow up on the matter.
37. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, would extend invitation later through the Secretariat for the next round of on-site inspection on the hygiene blackspots, in order to organise and update the blackspot action checklist.

blackspots on 23<sup>rd</sup> March and 28<sup>th</sup> March 2018 respectively.]

**Item 6: Wan Chai District Anti-mosquito Campaign 2018 (First Phase) – FEHD**

**(FEHC Paper No. 4/2018)**

38. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD introduced the paper to Members.
39. Members noted the arrangements details of Wan Chai District Anti-mosquito Campaign 2018 (First Phase) – FEHD.
40. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, was concerned about the infestation of mosquito near Victoria Park and Tin Hai District, and enquired of the FEHD whether there were measures for handling the issue. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson was also concerned about anti-mosquito methods and the number of mosquito-borne infections.
41. Mr LAU Chi-keung of the FEHD responded that the index of mosquito infestation during Summer was usually higher than that during Winter, and the infestation at Victoria Park and Tin Hau District was more severe than other areas. The FEHD would continue communicating with the LCSD to make improvements on the issue.

**Item 7: The 9th “Quit to Win” Smoke-free Community Campaign by Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (HKCSH)**

**(FEHC Paper No. 6/2018)**

42. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, welcomed Mr Lawrence CHU, the Senior Project Manager of the HKCSH, to the meeting.
43. Mr Lawrence CHU introduced the paper to Members.
44. After discussion, the Committee approved to support the WCDC as a supporting organisation of the campaign, and to print the WCDC logo on respective promotional products. It was agreed to submit respective applications for discussion of the Funding and General Affairs Committee in its 14<sup>th</sup> meeting on 22 February 2018.

[Post-meeting note: The Funding and General Affairs Committee of the WCDC in its 14th meeting on 22 February 2018 approved HKCSH's application for authorisation to display the WCDC logo in the promotional materials of the smoke-free community campaign.]

**Item 8: The "I'm So Smart" Community Health Promotion Programme 2018-2019 by the Department of Health (DH)**

**(FEHC Paper No. 7/2018)**

45. Ms Jacqueline CHUNG, the Chairperson, asked Dr CHAN Vivian of the DH to introduce the paper.
46. Dr CHAN Vivian of the DH introduced the paper to Members.
